

CONDUCT WORTHY OF THE GOSPEL

1. Conduct (politeuesthe)

- a) Translated “conduct” (NKJV)
- b) The focus is on the noun as aspect

2. The idea behind “politeuesthe”)

- a) Root meaning: Being a citizen (Politeuomai)
- b) Be a good and worthy citizen
 - i) Historical context (Philippi as a Roman colony)
 - ii) Theological context (Being a good citizen of the Kingdom of God)
- c) Present Imperative
 - i) Imperative... as a command
 - ii) Present tense... as a continual/ habitual activity

3. The gospel of Christ

- a) Believing in Christ for salvation
- b) We become citizens of the kingdom of God Ephesians 2:19
- c) The gospel of Christ has implications on our behavior

4. Worthy

- a) Key word (Adverb: axios)
- b) Philippians 2:27; Ephesians 4:1
 - i) Be a worthy citizen
 - ii) Walk worthy
- c) Adds meaning to the verb

CLEAR DEFINITION

1. Standing fast in one spirit
 - a) As a soldier
 - b) Not losing ground
 - c) Present Active Indicative)
 - i) Linear idea
 - ii) Continuous action
2. One mind striving together for the faith of the gospel
 - a) One mind (more literally “one soul”)
 - b) Striving (to contend)
 - c) Present active participle
 - i) Similar to the Present Active Indicative idea)
 - ii) Verbal idea in a participle is also strong

CONDUCT TO BE CONSISTENT

1. In Paul’s presence
2. In Paul’s absence
