a) The birth of Jesus Matthew 1:22-23; Isaiah 7:14

b) The place of ministry Matthew 4:14; Isaiah 9:1-2

- 2. With reference to Commitment to fulfill Scripture
 - a) Knowledge of the Scriptures Luke 4:17
 - b) Consciousness of fulfilling Scriptures Luke 4:21

SIGNIFICANCE OF THE SCRIPTURES

Some reasons why the Scriptures were given in the first place

- 1. To provide wisdom in life
- 2. To prevent proliferation of sin
- 3. To uphold righteousness
- 4. To strengthen the fabric of society
- 5. To bring about the fullness of God's blessings

THE SAD HISTORY OF ANCIENT ISRAEL

(Well noted in the Book of Judges and the Prophetic Books)

- 1. Rebellion
- 2. Rejection
- 3. Backsliding
- 4. Forsaking
- 5. Turning to idolatry
- 6. Refusal to repent

- 1. Identification of Jesus
 - a) As One who knew the Law (Scriptures)
 - b) As One who upheld the Law
 - c) As One who came to fulfil the requirements of the Law
- 2. Satisfying the Requirements of the Law to bring about salvation
 - a) Providing atonement for our sins
 - b) Satisfying Divine Justice
 - c) Gaining redemption for all mankind
 - d) Offering eternal life through faith in Jesus and His redemptive work
- 3. Bringing in a New Covenant
 - a) Beginning of the New Covenant Luke 22:20
 - b) Extensive discussion of the Old and New Covenant Hebrews 8
