"...And Elijah went up to the top of Carmel; then he bowed down on the ground, and put his face between his knees..." 1 Kings 18:42

- 1. Significance of posture in prayer
- a) Bowed down on the ground

Prostration

- b) Put his face between his knees
- Personal preference
- 2. Place of Prayer
- a) Praying throughout the drought period of 3 ¹/₂ years
- b) Praying for the son of the widow of Zarephath (1 Kings 17)
- c) Praying at Mount Carmel in the battle against the false prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18)
- d) Praying at Mount Carmel for the drought to end
- i) Prayer ensures that nothing is taken for granted

- "...And seven times he said, 'Go again.' " 1 Kings18:43d

'There is a cloud, as small as a man's hand, rising out of the sea!'..." 1 Kings 18:44a

"...So he said, 'Go up, say to Ahab, 'Prepare your chariot, and go down before the rain stops you.' " 1 Kings 18:44b

b) This teaches us about the personal involvement in the life and ministry of His servants.

2. Physical empowerment

Elijah ran faster than the chariot of Ahab (1 Kings 18:47b)
