(I) OCCUPIED ISRAEL

(II) NO RESPECT FOR THE LORD IN ISRAEL

- 1. The new occupants of the land did not have any respect for the Lord (2 Kings 17:25a)
- 2. God sent lions and some were killed by them (2 Kings 17:25b)

(III) SPECIAL REQUEST BY THE NEW INHABITANTS OF ISRAEL

- 1. They surmised that the God of Israel had sent lions to punish the new inhabitants (2 Kings 17:26a)
- 2. They wanted to learn "the rituals of the God of the land" (2 Kings 17:26b)
- 3. The king of Assyria sent one of the priests of Israel to teach about the rituals of the God of the land (2 Kings 17:27)
