- 3. And the children of Israel again did evil in the sight of the LORD Judges 3:12
- 4. The children of Israel again did evil in the sight of the LORD Judges 4:1
- 5. Then the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD Judges 6:1

- 2. He would respond to their cries and send a deliverer, a judge
- 3. Series of Judges
 - a) Othniel: Mesopotamian enemy
 - b) Ehud: Moabites

- c) Shangar: Philistines
- d) Deborah: Canaanites
- e) Gideon: Midianites

OPPRESSION IN THE DAYS OF GIDEON

- 1. Three sets of enemies mentioned
 - a) The Midianites (most prominent) Judges 6:1
 - b) The Amalakites Judges 6:3
 - c) People of the East Judges 6:3
- 2. Plight of Israel
 - a) Lived in dens and caves Judges 6:2
 - b) Lived in the mountains Judges 6:2
 - c) Destruction of the land Judges 6:4-5
 - d) Israel greatly impoverished Judges 6:6

SENDING OF A PROPHET

- 1. Unnamed prophet Judges 6:8
- 2. He works separately from the Judges God raised up
- 3. His task is to bring a special message from God Judges 6:8-10
 - a) To remind Israel of what God had said to them
 - b) To urge Israel to repent from their sin of disobedience
