- 1. Tola who judged Israel for 23 years **Judges 10:1-12** Tola was from the tribe of Issachar
- Jair who judged Israel for 22 years Judges 10:3-5
  Jair was from Gilead, a territory that was given to Gad and Manasseh Joshua 13:25, 31
  (Jair was mentioned in Joshua 13:30 as a city; Jair the Judge may well have come from Manasseh)

## THREAT OF FURTHER OPPRESSION BY THE AMMONITES Judges 10:17-18

- 1. They had encamped in Gilead to attack Israel
- 2. There were no outstanding leaders in Israel to battle the Ammonites
- 3. Gilead was desperate and made a solemn pledge Whoever could deliver Gilead would be appointed the ruler
