#### Conduct worthy of the gospel

"Only let your conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ," (Phil 1:27)

- 1. πολιτεύεσθε ... politeuomai... (English word: politics) behave as a citizen
- a. Philippi was a Roman colony
- b. It was necessary for its citizen to abide by Roman rule
- c. We are also meant to be citizens of heaven
- d. We are to behave and conduct ourselves well as citizens of heaven
- Cf... "For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ." (Phil 3:20)
- 2. As heavenly citizens, we should conduct ourselves worthy of the gospel
- a. Only... We are to only conduct ourselves worthy of the gospel
- b. Paul's example of conducting himself worthy of the gospel...good example to follow
- 3. How we should live
- a. cf. Paul Acts 23:1... "Then Paul, looking earnestly at the council, said, "Men and brethren, I have lived (πεπολίτευμαι τῷ θεῷ) in all good conscience before God until this day.""
- b. This is how we should live for Christ
- "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain." (Phil 1:21)

## A sense of purpose in how we live

"so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of your affairs," (Phil 1:27)

- 1. The use of the ἵνα... particle ... that ... indicate purpose
- a. hina would indicate purpose

- b. The brethren were to conduct themselves with a purpose in mind
- 2. εἴτε ...conjunction ... whether ...or
- a. Whether Paul comes and see them or being absent
- b. The purpose of his conduct does not depend on whether Paul was there or not
- 3. Paul may hear good things about the Philippian brethren
- a. He may hear good things about their conduct
- b. This is was the purpose of Paul's command to conduct themselves...that he would hear a good report

### **Purpose of our conduct**

- 1. Standing together in unity
- "that you stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel," (Phil 1:27)
- a. στήκετε ... steko... stand, standfast
- b. In one spirit
- c. Standing firm in one spirit
- 2. Striving together for the faith of the gospel
- a. With one soul
- b. συναθλοῦντες ... sunathleo... sun (with) + athleo (strive, compete) ... strive together...
- 3. For the faith of the gospel
- a. τῆ πίστει... ho pistis... the faith
- b. τοῦ εὐαγγελίου... ho euaggelion... the gospel
- c. The faith...reference to all that has been said about faith...content
- d. This faith is something that result from the gospel
- 4. We are to strive together with one soul for the faith of the gospel
- a. The apostle Paul had set the example of how to strive for the faith of the gospel
- b. The brethren are learning to do this together
