The challenge to have the mind of Christ

"Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus," (Phil 2:5)

- 1. Paul looked to the Lord Jesus as an example to the brethren
- 2. The challenge is to know the mind of Christ
- i. ppoveite ... phroneo... think, exercise the mind
- ii. ἐν Χριστῷ Ἰησοῦ...in Christ Jesus... use of the dative
- 3. The command is given for the mind of Christ to be in us
- i. The use of the imperative... a command
- ii. ἐν ὑμῖν... in you...use of the dative
- 4. Reasons for this
- a. One mindset to follow
- b. To develop a greater sense of oneness
- c. To demonstrate what Paul had just taught...lowliness of mind (Phil 2:3,4)

Appreciating the divine nature of Christ

"who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God," (Phil 2:6)

- 1. Paul was writing about a theological truth about Christ
- 2. Christ is being described as being in the form of God
- a. $\mu o \rho \phi \tilde{\eta} \dots$ morphe... form
- i. Look at the essence
- ii. God has no form
- b. ὑπάρχων ... huparcho... being under, to exist
- i. Present participle
- ii. Main verb ... ηγησατο

- c. He was divine in His essence
- 3. He was co-equal with God
- a. $\dot{\eta}\gamma\dot{\eta}\sigma\alpha\tau$ o ... hegeomai... to think, to consider, to lead
- b. ɛĩva... einai... to be, exist... infinitive of purpose
- c. It was not "robbery" to declare this
- d. He existed with the purpose to be equal with God

Theological truths about the divinity of Christ in the gospels

1. He is omnipresent	(John 1:1,2)
2. He is omnipotent	(John 1:3)
3. He is omniscient	(John 2:24)

- a. ἐκένωσεν... kenoo... to make empty
- b. What did Christ empty Himself of?
- i. His divine privileges
- ii. Limited Himself
- c. The use of the aorist... Once and for all
- 2. λαβών...lambano...to take
- 3. μορφήν ... morphe... form.... Form a bondservant (Phil 2:6)
- 4. ὑμοιώματι ... homoioma... likeness... The likeness of man

- 2. The human external nature
