





Missteps in Our Walks of Faith

During these past few weeks at Youth Worship Service, we have seen how missteps in our walks of faith are inevitable. Abram's example has shown us that walking with God isn't a linear journey, but it can be filled with moments of succeeding and failing to exercise faith in God.

In Genesis 16, we see how one misstep set off a 'chain reaction' of mistakes. It all started when Sarai came up with a human solution to her problem of barrenness. Even though the Lord had explicitly promised Abram that he would have an heir and multiple descendants, Sarai and Abram failed to trust in the Lord's timing and took matters into their own hands.

Why did Sarai and Abram not trust in the Lord? Had He not proven to them His faithfulness, love and graciousness over and over again? Had they not already come to trust in the Lord as their shield?

We can see from Abram's example that trusting in God is not easy. Though we may trust in God in one situation, it does not mean it will be easy to always trust in God in all situations. Instead, it is a lesson that constantly needs to be applied and reapplied in the face of new challenges. As we walk with God, testing will come. In each and every test, it is our challenge to consciously apply our faith and to trust in the Lord again and again.



A God Who Sees

Last week, we also learnt how God is One who sees all things. The idea of a God who sees us in our time of need is comforting, but the idea of a God who sees our mistakes might sound intimidating to some. We often feel vulnerable when our mistakes are exposed for others to see. We worry how others might perceive us in light of our mistakes.

But having a God who sees both the good and bad in us is not something to be afraid of. He is not solely a God of judgement, but is also a God of love. We see this when Hagar fled from Sarai and the Angel of the LORD visited her. The Lord had to rebuke

Hagar for her misstep, for despising Sarai, but He did so gently. Though the Lord has to correct us when we are wrong, He does so with a heart of love, not from a place of condemnation. The Angel of the LORD also protected Hagar when she was in the wilderness, a vulnerable place for her to be all by herself.

Our God who sees our mistakes continues to love us in spite of the mistakes we make. He gives us His grace when we falter, and lovingly guides us back on track. We need not fear making mistakes, neither do we have to be ashamed of them. Instead, let us seek to be humble when receiving correction from the Lord, and allow Him to teach us important lessons when we stumble.
