COME AND WORSHIP




INTRODUCTION

 - a. A simple approach to faith in God
 - b. It takes time to digest all that God had said
 - c. He chose to wait for God to fulfil what He promised



Asking questions

I must confess that at times I am afraid to ask questions of God or of the Bible because I have associated a questioning spirit to an irreverent one. Last week, I was glad to have caught a glimpse of the heart of Abram as he raised questions to God. He was not irreverent.

It is not wrong to ask questions. But it matters how we ask them, and how we receive God's answers.

The heart of the questioner

Abram knew his place. He addressed God as "LORD GOD", and this stemmed from a heart of humility. With honesty, Abram brought his fear and uncertainty before God. Abram asked God questions because he desired to believe. Behind the promise that God had given to Abram was the Promisor-God Himself. Abram looked to God, the Promisor, to strengthen his faith.

I often have many fears and uncertainties about the future. At times, God's promises seem insufficient in soothing my overwhelming fear. Like Abram, I need to do more than rehearse God's promise to myself again. I need to look at God who has given His promises to me.

God is greater than our fears

"The word of the LORD came to Abram" (Genesis 15:1a, 4). It is through the Word that the Lord answers and quells our fears.




The Lord reassured Abram, "Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield, your exceedingly great reward." (Genesis 15:1b) God gave Abram a great promise that an heir would come from his own body. This was followed by a reiteration of His promise that his descendants would be as numerous as the stars!

Faith to believe

God's responses quietened Abram's heart. God's promises brought strength to Abram's faith. Abram was able to see God again with enlightened eyes. "And he believed in the LORD, and He accounted it to him for righteousness." (Genesis 15:6)

Truly, our God is so patient when we come to Him with our questions. He gently responds to our questions with precious promises that strengthen our wavering faith! I am challenged to have a response just like Abram's- to keep my eyes on God and to believe in His promises.


THE LORD SMELLED A SOOTHING AROMA

Message: "Walk before Me and be blameless"

Text: Genesis 5:19-24; 17:1-4

Previously, God had intimated to Abram directly that an heir would come from his own body. Instead of applying faith to wait on the Lord to fulfil this promise, Sarai urged Abram to marry her maid, Hagar, in order to produce an heir.

Abram was not blameless when he acceded to Sarai's plan without consulting the Lord. Neither was Abram blameless in the way he treated Hagar. How would God respond to Abram's misstep? What would He say to Abram?

We will find out next week when we continue our study of Abram's journey of faith!
