"MY HORN YOU HAVE EXALTED"

*

The Sovereign LORD on high (Psalm 92:8) is a Profound God who is Personal to all who have a faith-relationship with Him. The author of Psalm 92 enjoyed such a relationship with God and dedicated time on the Sabbath day to reflect on the Lord's Personal involvement in his life.

"But my horn You have exalted like a wild ox;
I have been anointed with fresh oil.

My eye also has seen my desire on my enemies;

My ears hear my desire on the wicked

Who rise up against me."

PSALM 92:10-11

GOD'S WORK IN THE PSALMIST

- 1.. Strengthened
 - a. The horn is an emblem of strength
 - b. An exalted horn is a symbol of power
 - c. God granted strength and power like that of a wild ox

2. Refreshed

- a. Anointing is often associated with being chosen for an appointment
- b. Being anointed with fresh oil can also describe the way God refreshes the spirit
- c. The Psalmist had personally experienced his spirit refreshed by the Lord

GOD'S HELP AGAINST WICKED ENEMIES

God does not only work in us to strengthen and refresh, He also helps us against our wicked enemies.

- 1. Wicked enemies
 - a. The enemies of the Psalmist are the wicked
 - b. They had risen up against him
- 2. God personally dealt with these enemies
 - a. The wicked are also the enemies of God (Psalm 92:9)
 - b. The Psalmist trusted that God would deal with them
 - c. Indeed, he witnessed his desire on the wicked fulfilled by the Lord

The pressures of school and life may at times deplete our strength and energy, but our Omnipotence God is able to grant us triumphant strength and refresh our spirit. With the Lord's Help, we can live victoriously even when things around us threaten to overwhelm. It is more than amazing for God to be personally involved in our lives, working both in us and for us! Let this marvelous truth compel us to draw close to God and develop a faith-relationship with Him!



The lesson of Abraham sacrificing Isaac is not a new one. However, each time this lesson is taught, I'm always amazed at how there's always something new to learn and discover!

Abraham's Progression of Faith

God's command for Abraham to sacrifice Isaac was not so much a test to produce faith as it was a test to reveal faith. We have studied Abraham's journey of faith — from Abraham's initial steps of faith till this significant milestone where God tested Abraham. God had built Abraham up slowly, bit by bit, year by year. The journey to such a milestone was not smooth sailing, it involved many missteps and gentle correction from the Lord. This test revealed Abraham's state of faith. It was tried and proven. It became a proverbial faith.

Proverbial faith

How was Abraham's proverbial faith seen?

i. An Immediate Response

Abraham must have struggled when God first told him to sacrifice his son whom he loved. However, his prompt response in obedience showed how his faith in the Lord

took precedence. "Abraham rose early" (Genesis 22:3). At that point in time, Abraham did not know how God would provide. Yet, he did not stop trusting. By faith, He went to the place of which God had told him.

ii. God will provide

It took Abraham 3 days to arrive at the place of sacrifice. In those 3 days, what would have been on Abraham's mind? Was he confused or even angry that the Lord had given him this command?

We see how Abraham held fast to his faith. First, he told his servants that "We will come back." He believed that he and Isaac would return. Second, Abraham had faith in God's ability to raise Isaac from the dead. At that point in time, there were no records of someone being raised from the dead. Such was Abraham's faith! Though he had no precedent for this faith, he was confident in the Person of God and His power.

iii. In the Mount of the Lord it shall be provided


Abraham recognised that the Lord did provide. Why the Mount of God? Symbolically, Abraham was moving upward to God in faith! As Abraham moved to the Mount where the Lord was, God met him there and provided.

REFLECTIONS

A personal prayer

As I saw Abraham's progression of faith, I had to evaluate the state of my own faith. Has my faith stood the weathering of school and all its challenges? Beyond school, would the challenges in life reveal the strength of a personal faith?

As I have just started a new semester in school, it is a personal prayer to cultivate a stronger and deeper faith in a God who has promised to provide and has kept this promise!
