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COME AND WORSHIP

"The LORD is MERCIFUL AND GRACIOUS"

Previously, we read that the Lord is righteous and would execute justice (Psalm 103:7). The Psalmist David presented more attributes of God that complement His righteousness. The Lord's righteous judgment is not without His mercy and grace!

> "The LORD is merciful and gracious, Slow to anger, and abounding in mercy. He will not always strive with us, Nor will He keep His anger forever. He has not dealt with us according to our sins, Nor punished us according to our iniquities."

PSALM 103:8-10

- 1. The attributes of God
 - a. Merciful
 - b. Gracious



- 2. God's righteous anger
 - a. God has made known His good and righteous ways to His people (Psalm 103:7)
 - b. He has the right to be angry when His people choose to disobey
 - c. His wrath is against all ungodliness and unrighteousness (Romans 1:18)
 - d. This would be an expression of His righteousness

- 3. Slow to anger
 - a. God is not reactive
 - b. He gives us the chance to repent from our sins
 - c. This is God's longsuffering and lovingkindness toward us
- 4. God's abounding mercy
 - a. We are responsible for our actions
 - b. We deserve to be punished for our iniquities
 - c. But God has not dealt with us according to our sin
 - d. Nor has He punished us
 - e. His mercy is abounding!

A RIGHT PERSPECTIVE OF GOD'S ANGER

We do not like it when someone is angry with us, and we can even think that it is wrong to be angry. In this light, many end up having misgivings about God's anger.

The anger of God must be properly understood. God is not angered for no rhyme or reason. God is holy and righteous and His anger is justified against the wicked. At the same time, the Lord is one who will give chance after chance for a sinful man to repent. Out of His lovingkindness, He will be slow to anger!

A RESPONSE TO GOD'S MERCY AND GRACE

All of us are wretched and deserving of punishment. Every day, we sin in our thought, in word and in deed. The very fact that we are still alive today is a demonstration of God's mercy and grace. Let us humbly recognise that we all need the mercy and grace of God, and respond with gratitude, seizing every chance that He has given to repent from our sins, and find forgiveness in Him! A heart that resonates with this truth will desire to bless His name indeed!

INTRODUCTION

In the lesson from Genesis 25:19-28, we moved on from Abraham's life and took a look at Isaac and his family. We could see some of Abraham's influence on Isaac who also involved prayer in his life.

PLEADING

At the beginning, we see some similarities between Abraham and Isaac. Isaac and Rebekah suffered from the problem of barrenness for 20 years. During this time, Isaac prayed about this problem on behalf of Rebekah, pleading with the Lord.

We learnt that pleading is one type of prayer we can make. We can pray for the Lord to provide solutions to a specific problem, such as barrenness. It is different from a casual prayer, we need to turn to the Lord and sincerely plead for help. A genuine plea will see us pray about our concern continuously. Isaac and Rebekah received an answer from the Lord, who enabled Rebekah to conceive. The Lord will answer prayers, if we persevere in praying!

INQUIRING

After Rebekah had conceived, we see another example of how the family involved prayer and the Lord in their lives. When Rebekah was in distress because of a difficult pregnancy, she inquired of the Lord for answers to her discomfort, since she did not know why the pregnancy was difficult.

Again, the prayer was answered. The Lord replied with something so profound, and told Rebekah that she was bearing a pair of twins. He implied that they would have an unusual relationship, as the younger would be greater than the older. When Esau and Jacob were born, they appeared very different. Jacob, the younger twin, even displayed some odd behaviour of holding his brother's foot.

An inquiry is another type of prayer we can make when we are seeking guidance or answers. For instance, as a university student thinking about what course to study and what career path to follow, I can pray to the Lord and ask Him to show me answers in His time.



LACK OF PRAYER

God's profound answer to Rebekah could have been a sign to Isaac and Rebekah to raise their children with care and to involve God. Unfortunately, they did not! Their lives did not appear to have any obvious or glaring problems and they had taken that for granted. God was not involved in how they raised their children, which could explain why Isaac ended up favouring Esau over Jacob. This created cracks in the family, and aggravated any conflict between the brothers.

This is what can happen when we take it for granted that our lives are going well and neglect prayer. The Lord is no longer involved and we can end up making our own foolish choices, which lead to bad outcomes. We should seek to pray more in our walk with the Lord, and about all the choices we make in our lives!
