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## **COME AND WORSHIP**

## "THE LORD IS MY LIGHT AND MY SALVATION"

Some may feel excited to enter into a new year, while for some others, they may feel a sense of fear — fear of the anticipated challenges. These challenges may be unavoidable, but we can choose the way we respond.

The life of the Psalmist David was filled with adversities. He was faced with enemies and foes who sought after his life. They were so great in number that they amounted to an "army" (Psalm 27:3). It would be understandable if some sense of fear descended upon David and threatened to destabilise him. Yet, David's approach to difficult circumstances was to exercise faith and confidence in the Lord!

1 "The LORD is my light and my salvation;
Whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the strength of my life;
Of whom shall I be afraid?
2 When the wicked came against me
To eat up my flesh,
My enemies and foes,
They stumbled and fell.
3 Though an army may encamp against me,
My heart shall not fear;
Though war may rise against me,
In this I will be confident."

PSALM 27:1-3

- 1. Natural responses to adversities
  - a. Fear
  - b. Apprehension
- 2. Fight fear with faith
  - a. "The LORD is my light and my salvation" Psalm 27:1a
    - i. David's hope was in God's help
    - ii. The Lord would deliver him from numerous enemies
  - b. "The LORD is the strength of my life" Psalm 27:1b
    - i. God would give strength to cope with distressing circumstances
    - ii. He would lead and empower David to triumph over his enemies

## Faith Dispels Fear And Instils Confidence

The greater challenge that David needed to overcome was not his enemies, but the sense of fear that could dominate his soul. Instead of allowing the natural response of fear to take over, David confronted it with faith in God. He would not be shaken even when a war could rise against him (Psalm 27:3). With the Lord with him, he knew that he would not be overcome by His enemies, and God would cause them to stumble and fall (Psalm 27:2). Therefore, he did not have to fear!

Even a life-threatening situation is not a reason to be fearful because God is our light and salvation, the strength of our lives. He will help us to emerge victorious over the challenges ahead, so let us begin the new year on a strong and triumphant note with our faith and confidence in God!

#### ISAAC CONTINUES TO BE SUSPICIOUS

21 Isaac said to Jacob, "Please come near, that I may feel you, my son, whether you *are* really my son Esau or not." 22 So Jacob went near to Isaac his father, and he felt him and said, "The voice *is* Jacob's voice, but the hands *are* the hands of Esau." 23 And he did not recognize him, because his hands were hairy like his brother Esau's hands; so he blessed him.

**24** Then he said, "Are you really my son Esau?" He said. "I am."

Genesis 27:21-24

- 1. Isaac is not convinced

  He wants to feel Jacob
- 2. Jacob drew near to his father
- 3. Isaac asked again"Are you really my son Esau?" Genesis 27:24a
- 4. Jacob lies yet again (The third time)

  He said. "I am."

  Genesis 27:24b

5. Isaac is half-convinced

"The voice is Jacob's voice, but the hands are the hands of Esau."

Genesis 27:22

- a. Jacob could not disguise his voice
- b. Isaac recognized Jacob's voice

#### THE FIRST-BORN BLESSING

- 1. Isaac ate the meal that was brought to him
- 2. He asked Jacob to draw near and to give him a kiss

  - **27** And he came near and kissed him; and he smelled the smell of his clothing, and blessed him and said:

"Surely, the smell of my son Is like the smell of a field Which the Lord has blessed.

28 Therefore may God give you Of the dew of heaven, Of the fatness of the earth, And plenty of grain and wine.

29 Let peoples serve you,
And nations bow down to you.
Be master over your brethren,
And let your mother's sons bow down to you.
Cursed be everyone who curses you,
And blessed be those who bless you!"

## REFLECTIONS



#### What we have learnt so far

At our last Youth Worship, we learnt about how Rebekah and Jacob carried out their plan of deceit to steal Esau's firstborn blessing. Isaac was initially suspicious of his son's identity when he heard Jacob's voice but he had covered himself in Esau's clothes to convincingly deceive his father. Isaac eventually gave in and blessed his son Jacob. This plan of deception eventually led to greater problems in the family, further solidifying the rift between the two brothers.

#### Growing problems in the family

Problems began as early as when the children were younger (Genesis 25). The family began to be divided as Isaac loved Esau and Rebekah favoured Jacob. The brothers were different in their personalities and they grew up distant, pursuing their own interests.

As Isaac grew older, he decided it was time to give the firstborn blessing to Esau. Faith was not present, and Isaac only focused on two things when approaching death—fresh game and his son Esau. The rest of his family were not involved at that point in time and that would stir a sense of disparity in the family. The error that Isaac had committed in not involving Rebekah

and his younger son Jacob, would lead to greater problems in the family, and the path of sin. Rebekah came up with a plan of deceit to allow her favourite son Jacob obtain Esau's firstborn blessing. Despite his initial fears, Jacob gave in to his mother and followed her plan to deceive his father.

#### Erroneous understanding about the first-born blessing

Though Isaac had quoted the words of the Lord when he gave the firstborn blessing to Jacob, this blessing was one that was more sentimental rather than spiritual. Strong faith was absent in the family, and there was no longer a deep sense of proper regard towards the Lord. The inspiration to obtain blessings was for self-gain rather than from faith in God, turning a blessing that was meant to be good to be something that led to further tensions, strife and betrayal in the family.

#### To find the right motivation for God's blessings

Blessings do not come simply because we prayed for it. We will have to play our part, learning to receive instruction to correct the errors in our lives, no matter how small they may be. Faith has to be there and cultivated further as we learn to seek the Lord not only at Youth Worship but in our daily lives. Faith has to be instilled in us, and further strengthened amidst the testings in life such as during examinations or when making difficult decisions. Through receiving instruction from God's word, may we seek to find inspiration to be people after God's own heart! This is something that I am deeply challenged to do! Though there are times that I grow weary in my walk of faith, I hope to continue growing my faith, allowing God's word to inspire the paths that I choose to walk in life.
