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
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COME AND WORSHIP

REVIEW OF GOD'S WORD

Let us review what we have learnt at our last Youth Worship!

YWS MESSAGE - 8 OCTOBER 2022 "JOSEPH REMEMBERED THE DREAMS" GENESIS 42:9

INTRODUCTION

- 1. In Egypt
 - a. All surrounding countries came to Egypt
 - b. Only in Egypt was there grain to feed the hungry millions
 - c. The famine was very severe
- 2. The problem the sons of Jacob faced
 - a. They had been accused of being spies
 - b. They knew that they could possibly be executed!
 - c. They were already in prison for three days

THE TEST PROPOSED BY THE GOVERNOR OF EGYPT

18 Then Joseph said to them the third day, "Do this and live, for I fear God:

19 If you *are* honest *men*, let one of your brothers be confined to your prison house; but you, go and carry grain for the famine of your houses.

20 And bring your youngest brother to me; so your words will be verified, and you shall not die." And they did so.

Genesis 42:18-20

- 1. The proposal made:
 - a. One of the men would be confined in prison
 - b. They can purchase grain for the family in Canaan
 - c. The youngest brother must be brought to Egypt on the next trip
- 2. If they agreed to this proposal
 - a. Their words would be verified
 - b. They would not die (executed as spies)

Genesis 42:20

CONVERSATION AMONG THE BROTHERS

21 Then they said to one another, "We *are* truly guilty concerning our brother, for we saw the anguish of his soul when he pleaded with us, and we would not hear; therefore this distress has come upon us."

22 And Reuben answered them, saying, "Did I not speak to you, saying, 'Do not sin against the boy'; and you would not listen? Therefore behold, his blood is now required of us."

Genesis 42:21-22

- 1. In full agreement among the brothers
 - a. They felt that they were truly guilty concerning their brother
 - b. They remembered what Joseph did:
 - i. The anguish of his soul
 - ii. His pleas made to them
 - c. They also remembered
 - i. They refused to hear Joseph
 - ii. They had been so angry and jealous
 - d. They were in deep distress now
 - i. This distress had come about because of their sin
 - ii. This was God's punishment

- 2. Reuben chipped in:
 - a. He had pleaded with the brothers not to kill Joseph
 - b. But no one had listened
 - c. This present distress was the judgment of God upon all of them

THE TEARS OF JOSEPH

- **23** But they did not know that Joseph understood *them*, for he spoke to them through an interpreter.
- **24** And he turned himself away from them and wept. Then he returned to them again, and talked with them. And he took Simeon from them and bound him before their eyes.

Genesis 42:23-24

- 1. The brothers had not recognised Joseph
- 2. They did not know that Joseph had understood all they were saying
- 3. All along, Joseph had used an interpreter
- 4. He was moved by what he had heard:
 - a. His brothers had recognised their wrong
 - b. They had been remorseful and regretful
- 5. Joseph turned away from his brothers
 - a. He needed to give vent to his emotions
 - b. He wept:
 - i. So many years had been wasted
 - ii. So much pain and suffering had been experienced by all

- 6. He returned to the brothers
 - a. He talked to the brothers further
 - b. Simeon was arrested and jailed
 - c. This was done right in front of them
 - d. The impact must have been very significant
- 7. All of these things
 - a. They were carefully planned
 - b. Joseph needed to know what their true character was
 - c. This was a huge, carefully planned test
- 8. The guilt of the brothers
 - a. There was fear
 - b. There was guilt
 - c. There was despair too
- 9. The proving of the brothers
 - a. They had been wicked once
 - b. They had changed
 - c. They were changed for the better!

A key problem


Deep distress came upon the brothers. They could not comprehend everything that happened to them thus far. Simeon was imprisoned and they still had to make their way back home to bring Benjamin back to Egypt. They also remembered what they did to Joseph, and were filled with guilt.

The confusion and guilt weighed on the brother's minds. Their hearts failed them and they were afraid.

What is this that God has done to us?

For the first time in a long while, the brothers made reference to God. Their outcry recorded in Genesis 42:28, "What is this that God has done to us?" was not one which demonstrated faith but a lack of knowledge and understanding of God.

It may seem that the response of the brothers is one that we can't relate to or comprehend. In fact, one might be tempted to say that we would turn to prayer when faced with trying circumstances.



Though turning to the Lord when faced with difficulties is a response we all strive to have, I would admit that the instinctive response is more akin to the brother's desperate outcry. When faced with challenges, the heart often fails, and the spirit is weak.

Guarding the Heart with His Word

The heart fails because the problems of life gnaw at it. It is not strong enough to cope with the problems we face. Therefore, it is important to know how to keep our hearts with all diligence (Proverbs 4:23).

How can we go about guarding our hearts? Personally, I've found the words from Martyn Lloyd Jones helpful. He identifies the cause of our heart's failure to be our tendency to listen to ourselves, rather than speak to ourselves with the Lord's Word.

We listen to what our hearts feel, and as emotional beings, we feel deeply. We feel angry when someone steps on our toes. We are disappointed when we don't meet our own expectations. We feel confused when unexpected things happen to us. When we feel deeply, we often get bogged down by the circumstances in our lives.



It is different when we speak to ourselves with the Lord's word. When we do that, we consciously remind ourselves of God. Who God is, what God has done, and what God has pledged Himself to do. The heart then is guarded because it is armed with God's word. The heart is encouraged, and strengthened. Fresh courage is found to take on the challenges of life.

Though this is something hard to practise, we all need to start somewhere. The process of allowing the Lord's word to speak to us, rather than listening to our emotions increasingly becomes our first response with practice. However, it is ultimately the Lord's grace that will enable us to guard our hearts.

We can't control the challenges we may face in life, but we have control over how we guard our hearts! Let us seek to keep our hearts with all diligence, so that we may rise above life's difficulties.
