Psalm 119:97 - 104

- 1. Having a genuine love for the word of God
 - a. It does not mean that it was a steadfast love
 - b. It was a genuine and sincere love that naturally came from appreciating the word of God and its benefits.
 - c. The Psalmist also sought to cultivate that love for it further.

- 3. Applying of wisdom
 - a. Hating every false way
 - b. Restraining our feet from every evil way

THE WORD OF GOD AS A SOURCE OF LIGHT

- 1. Finding light from God's word
 - a. The imagery of lamp
 - i. It shines light in the midst of darkness
 - ii. The world is full of darkness
 - b. The word of God as a source of light
 - i. It enlightened the Psalmist to His truth
 - ii. It gave him insights
 - c. It brings light to his path
 - i. It brings light on where to walk in this dark world
 - ii. The Psalmist recognises how much he needed to follow the pathway that is good and safe.
- 2. He was making an oath to keep His word

"I have sworn and confirmed that I will keep Your righteous judgments." Psalm 119:105-106

- a. Sworn
- b. Confirmed
- c. To keep His righteous judgments
- d. We must be careful not to make such oath because we feel the need to
- e. We have to walk prudently before the Lord (Eccl. 5:1-7)

- c. He continued to pray in the midst of this
- 2. Praying in the midst of much affliction

"Revive me, O Lord, according to Your word. Accept, I pray, the freewill offering of my mouth, O Lord, and teach me Your judgments..." Psalm 119:107-108

- a. Praying for revival
- b. Asking the Lord to accept His praise of Him.
- c. Praying for the Lord to teach further

1. Not forget His law

"My life is continually in my hand, yet I do not forget Your law." Psalm 119:109

2. Not strayed from His precepts
