What joy and privilege it is to belong to the Lord and be part of this household of God! As we congregate to worship our greatly exalted God, let us be filled with awe and adoration for Him!





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
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COME AND WORSHIP

Genesis 46:1

- 1. Israel's journey to Egypt
 - a. He took with him all that he had
 - b. He came to Beersheba
- 2. Worship of the LORD
 - a. This had not been done for a long time
 - b. This was resumed with the revival of Jacob's spirit
 - c. God was called "The God of his father Isaac"



GOD SPEAKS TO JACOB AGAIN

2 Then God spoke to Israel in the visions of the night, and said, "Jacob, Jacob!"

And he said, "Here I am."

GOD'S WORD TO JACOB

- **3** So He said, "I am God, the God of your father; do not fear to go down to Egypt, for I will make of you a great nation there.
- **4** I will go down with you to Egypt, and I will also surely bring you up again; and Joseph will put his hand on your eyes."

Genesis 46:3-4

- 1. Re-introduction
 - a. "I am God"
 - b. "The God of your father"
- 2. Re-assurance
 - a. Do not fear to go down to Egypt
 - i. Abraham was forbidden to remain in Egypt
 - ii. Isaac was forbidden to go to Egypt
 - iii. But Jacob was encouraged to go to Egypt
 - b. For I will make of you a great nation there
 - i. A great nation would arise
 - ii. This was partial fulfilment of a prophecy given to Abraham (Genesis 15:12-16)
 - **12** Now when the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram; and behold, horror *and* great darkness fell upon him.
 - **13** Then He said to Abram: "Know certainly that your descendants will be strangers in a land *that is* not theirs, and will serve them, and they will afflict them four hundred years.
 - **14** And also the nation whom they serve I will judge; afterward they shall come out with great possessions.

Genesis 15:12-14

- 3. Revealed: The death of Jacob
 - a. God will go with Jacob to Egypt
 - i. I will go down with you to Egypt Genesis 46:4a
 - ii. And I will also surely bring you up again;and Joseph will put his hand on your eyes Genesis 46:4b
 - b. Jacob will die in Egypt
 - i. Joseph will put his hand on his eyes
 - ii. Joseph will be there at his death

REFLECTION

Last week at Youth Worship, Pastor taught us from Genesis 46:1-7. God had to reintroduce Himself to Jacob, and He also did not address Jacob by his new name "Israel" because Jacob had fallen so far away from God, such that their relationship was barely existing. Yet God, in His grace and mercy, did not give up on Jacob, but instead reached out to him and even gave him assurance that He would not only protect Jacob on his way to Egypt but eased his fears by promising him that he would not die in a foreign land and that, "Joseph will put his hands on your eyes."

This lesson encouraged me as there are times when I feel so far away from God, returning to Him seems difficult and I feel discouraged. Sometimes I even feel that God is "fed up" with me. However, hearing Pastor's message deeply uplifted me because I can now appreciate that not only does God patiently and lovingly reach out and want to relate to me, like He did to Jacob who had fallen so far, He even promises to protect and support me. It is better not to allow ourselves to stray from Him, but when we do because of our unfaithful human nature, we can always find renewal of our faith and spirit in God. How wonderful it is that our God so lovingly reaches out and guides us back to Him even when we fail!
