YOUTH WORSHIP REFLECTIONS

Last week, Pastor reminded us of the significant "episodes" in Jacob's life.

Significant episodes in Jacob's life

In his younger age, Jacob sinned greatly against his father Isaac and his brother Esau, stealing his brother's birthright by tricking him, and lying to his father. It was only after he fled from home and went to Bethel that he found salvation in the Lord when God reached out to him in a vision. Jacob then served Laban for 14 years to gain the hand of Rachel, before returning to Canaan where he had to face Esau. In Jacob's own family, there was great turmoil- there was a lack of closeness between him and his children. Jacob returned to the Lord when he went to Egypt to see Joseph. Finally, he gave admonitions to each of his sons before he breathed his last.

Jacob's final words

In Jacob's final words, a sense of connection to the patriarchs before him was seen, in his reference to the people in Canaan as "my people" and "my fathers". This connection

was not seen in the early years of Jacob's life, yet this sense of connection that Jacob had grown to have was extremely important.

Because of the sense of connection that he felt, Jacob was conscious to give specific instructions to be buried in Canaan with his forebears, reflecting his spiritual understanding that Canaan was the promised land from God.

My challenge

Even as Bethany celebrates 50 years of ministry, I am challenged to develop this sense of connection with the church. Despite having grown up in church, finding this connection is not a given. It must be one that is personal and not one that can be "passed down" from generation to generation. With this sense of connection to the Church, I must be conscious to be faithful to the Lord and to grow in my Faith. I want to continue to call Bethany my second home. As I continue to grow physically and spiritually, learning more valuable and precious lessons from the Lord's Word each week, I hold this hope that in time to come, should the Lord find me faithful, He will call me to serve Him significantly in the different ministries in church.
