


PUTTING OUR TRUST IN THE ALMIGHTY GOD

REVIEW OF GOD'S WORD

Let us review what we have learnt at our last Youth Worship!

YWS MESSAGE - 29 APRIL 2023 "GOD MEANT IT FOR GOOD" GENESIS 50:20

INTRODUCTION

- 1. The Death and Burial of Jacob
 - a. It was a long-drawn event
 - b. It was a very grand funeral
- 2. Old fears arose
 - a. The brothers of Joseph became afraid
 - b. They approached Joseph fearfully

THE RISE OF OLD FEARS

15 When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "Perhaps Joseph will hate us, and may actually repay us for all the evil which we did to him."

16 So they sent *messengers* to Joseph, saying, "Before your father died he commanded, saying,

17 'Thus you shall say to Joseph: "I beg you, please forgive the trespass of your brothers and their sin; for they did evil to you." Now, please, forgive the trespass of the servants of the God of your father." And Joseph wept when they spoke to him.

18 Then his brothers also went and fell down before his face, and they said, "Behold, we *are* your servants."

Genesis 50:15-18

- 1. The reality of Jacob's death sank in
 - a. The mourning period was over
 - b. Jacob, their father, was no more
- 2. Real fears arose
 - a. Fear that Joseph would repay their evil
 - b. Fear that they would be executed
- 3. Messengers (Messages) were sent to Joseph
 - a. They claimed that their father Jacob had given this advice
 - b. The contents of this message

"I beg you, please forgive the trespass of your brothers and their sin; for they did evil to you."

Now, please, forgive the trespass of the servants of the God of your father."

Genesis 50:17

- c. This message cannot be verified
 - i. It was not written
 - ii. Joseph did not receive this word from his father directly
 - iii. It is possible but perhaps not very likely
- d. Bowing before Joseph
 - i. They bowed to Joseph
 - ii. They presented themselves as "servants of Joseph"

ALLAYING OF THE FEARS

- **19** Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid, for *am* I in the place of God?
- **20** But as for you, you meant evil against me; *but* God meant it for good, in order to bring it about as *it is* this day, to save many people alive.
- **21** Now therefore, do not be afraid; I will provide for you and your little ones." And he comforted them and spoke kindly to them.

Genesis 50:19-21

- 1. He sought to allay their fears
- 2. His word to his brothers
 - a. He spoke about God
 - b. God's hand revealed
 - i. Evil was turned around
 - ii. Good prevailed
 - iii. Joseph's destiny was to save lives
 - c. Joseph's promise
 - i. They need never fear
 - ii. He will provide for them
 - iii. He will provide for their families (children)
 - d. Word of comfort and kindness were spoken

THE DEATH OF JOSEPH

- **22** So Joseph dwelt in Egypt, he and his father's household. And Joseph lived one hundred and ten years.
- **23** Joseph saw Ephraim's children to the third *generation*. The children of Machir, the son of Manasseh, were also brought up on Joseph's knees.
- **24** And Joseph said to his brethren, "I am dying; but God will surely visit you, and bring you out of this land to the land of which He swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob."
- **25** Then Joseph took an oath from the children of Israel, saying, "God will surely visit you, and you shall carry up my bones from here."
- **26** So Joseph died, *being* one hundred and ten years old; and they embalmed him, and he was put in a coffin in Egypt.

Genesis 50:22-26

- 1. The death of Joseph
 - a. He lived to 110 years old
 - b. He saw his children grow up
 - c. He saw his grandchildren and great-grandchildren
- 2. The last words of Joseph
 - a. He spoke of dying
 - b. He spoke of his faith that God would bring them out to the Promised Land

- 3. Obtaining an oath from all his relatives
 - a. When God visits them
 - b. They are to bring his bones out of Egypt to be buried in Canaan
- 4. Burial of Joseph
 - a. He was embalmed
 - b. He was put in a coffin in Egypt

The narrative

Last week, we concluded our study of Genesis at Youth Worship after two years. In Genesis 50, we read about how Joseph's brothers were fearful of how Joseph might repay their evil deeds after Jacob's passing, but instead, Joseph responded with love and gentleness. He allayed their fears and meant no harm, and even promised to continue providing for his brothers' families. Through these, we see the outstanding and godly character of Joseph, how he was able to forgive his brothers, and even go a step further to display generosity and tender love towards them. Joseph was able to have this type of response only because of his faith and trust in God.

God's perfect and powerful plan

Joseph's faith in the Lord helped him to see beyond the many tribulations that plagued his life, including his brothers' malicious deeds towards him, becoming a slave in Egypt, experiencing the famine and more. Though Joseph faced much adversity as a result of man's evil toward him, he bore a strong

and steadfast faith that helped him trust that "God meant it for good". Joseph trusted that God had a perfect and powerful plan for everything, and aligned his principles to God's greater plan via the practical and personal application of his faith by providing for his brothers. Our challenge Just as God was in control in Abraham, Isaac and Joseph's time, He continues to be in control today. In Romans 8:28, we read that "all things work together for good to those who love God" and are assured in verse 27 that the Spirit of God will intercede for us according to His will. Our challenge then is to make this truth a principle in our lives and seek to personalise it in our approach to all of life's circumstances. To do so. we will require knowledge, wisdom, discernment and faith which we can cultivate through reading the Scriptures, keeping an active prayer life, and developing a deeper relationship with God. Personally, I have been seeking to practically apply this lesson as I face major decisions and crossroads in life. Since my A levels last year, I have witnessed the Lord's Hand in His goodness and keeping through providing me with the strength and help I needed in times of physical weakness. We are excited to announce the return of Junior Camp for our children aged 7 -12 years old.


