
We will stand as children of the promise,

- 1. Three areas of concern are noted in Exodus 1-2
 - a. The children of Israel had become enslaved
 - b. The life of Moses as the son of the daughter of Pharaoh
 - c. The LORD God
- 2. How do we see the connection?

MOSES FLEEING FROM EGYPT

13 And when he went out the second day, behold, two Hebrew men were fighting, and he said to the one who did the wrong, "Why are you striking your companion?"

14 Then he said, "Who made you a prince and a judge over us? Do you intend to kill me as you killed the Egyptian?"

So Moses feared and said, "Surely this thing is known!"

Exodus 2:13-14

- 1. He was not accepted by the Hebrews
- 2. He was hunted by Pharaoh because he had killed an Egyptian officer
- 3. Moses had no choice but to flee from Egypt

MOSES IN THE LAND OF MIDIAN

16 Now the priest of Midian had seven daughters. And they came and drew water, and they filled the troughs to water their father's flock.17 Then the shepherds came and drove them away; but Moses stood up and helped them, and watered their flock.

18 When they came to Reuel their father, he said, "How is it that you have come so soon today?"

19 And they said, "An Egyptian delivered us from the hand of the shepherds, and he also drew enough water for us and watered the flock."

20 So he said to his daughters, "And where is he? Why is it that you have left the man? Call him, that he may eat bread."

21 Then Moses was content to live with the man, and he gave Zipporah his daughter to Moses. **22** And she bore *him* a son. He called his name Gershom, for he said, "I have been a stranger in a foreign land."

Exodus 2:16-22

- 1. The scene at a well
 - a. Wells were important places
 - b. They supplied water for both human beings and animals
 - c. The daughters of Reuel, who was a priest, were shepherdesses
 - d. They had brought their father's flock to the well
 - e. But they were bullied by some shepherds



- 2. Moses was a gallant young man
 - a. He saw the shepherdesses being bullied by the shepherds
 - b. He went to help the shepherdesses
- 3. The daughters reported this incident to Jethro
 - a. His daughters were instructed to invite Moses for dinner
 - b. He ended up marrying Zipporah
- 4. His firstborn was called "Gershom"

 To symbolise that he was "a stranger in a foreign land"

THE CHILDREN OF ISRAEL IN THE LAND OF EGYPT

Now it happened in the process of time that the king of Egypt died. Then the children of Israel groaned because of the bondage, and they cried out; and their cry came up to God because of the bondage.

Exodus 2:23

- 1. The Pharaoh that had enslaved the children of Israel had died
- 2. But this did not mean that life was easier.
- 3. If at all, things had become even harder
 - a. The children of Israel groaned because of their bondage
 - b. They cried out
 - c. Their cry came up to God because of their bondage



THE LORD'S RESPONSE TO THE CRIES OF THE CHILDREN OF ISRAEL

- **24** So God heard their groaning, and God remembered His covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob.
- **25** And God looked upon the children of Israel, and God acknowledged *them*.

Exodus 2:24-25

- 1. A masterful description of how God responded
 - a. God heard
 - b. God remembered His covenant with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob
 - i. This does not mean that God has forgotten
 - ii. It means that God is going to fulfil what He had promised
 - c. God looked upon the children of Israel
 - i. He understood them
 - ii. He felt compassion towards them
 - d. God acknowledged them
 - i. They were the children of Israel
 - ii. They were the descendants of Abraham and Isaac
- 2. The LORD was now going to execute a great plan
 - a. To deliver Israel from Egypt
 - b. To bring them into the land of Canaan
 - c. To fulfil His covenant promise to the patriarchs of Israe

CONCLUSION

- 1. God knows all the problems we have in our life
- 2. He will respond to us when we cry out to Him
- 3. He will help us overcome life's many challenges





REFLECTIONS

Moses' faith

Last week at Youth Worship, we learnt about the faith which Moses possessed but failed to apply at times. Moses displayed faith in choosing to suffer and identify himself with the Hebrews instead of being identified as the son of Pharaoh's daughter (Hebrews 11:24). However, Moses failed to apply faith when he killed the Egyptian officer who was beating a Hebrew slave (Exodus 2:11-12). Moses sought to resolve the dispute according to his own wisdom and this caused him to falter. After fleeing from Egypt to evade the Pharaoh's wrath, Moses sought to apply faith in the Lord's protection and presence, seeing Him who is invisible (Hebrews 11:27).





Distinction between 'my faith' and 'by faith'

Our faith is meant to be a real and active one, and thus we cannot stop at simply having faith. Pastor gave the analogy of "changing gears" in how we could apply faith. Just as the gears must be intentionally changed for a car to perform well, we cannot apply faith in the same manner for every problem we encounter. The content of our faith should be that 1.God hears, 2.God remembers His Covenant, 3.God looks upon us and 4. God acknowledges us (Exodus 2:24). Hiding these truths in our heart would allow us to apply our faith in different circumstances, that we may truly approach life "by faith". God's response to the cries of the children of Israel amidst their bondage is also a precious reminder that He will similarly respond to and help us when we cry out to Him.



For me, this lesson has prompted me to evaluate if my faith is a passive one. At times, I find myself turning to faith as a last resort out of sheer desperation or limiting the situations where I would involve faith. For instance, I tend to exercise faith during examinations, but I recognise that faith can be applied even in my everyday tasks or in my relationships with others. Thus, I am seeking to apply faith in all situations, and to also approach all areas of my life with a faith perspective. To discover how exactly I may apply faith in different contexts, I seek to truly believe and understand that God hears me, He will fulfil His promises, He shows concern for me and will acknowledge me. This understanding is deepened through diligently meditating on His Word!

May we all cultivate a growing and active faith that will see us through the different stages of life!
