

INTRODUCTION

- 1. Review the Plagues
 - a. Blood
 - b. Frogs
 - c. Lice
 - d. Flies

 - f. Boils

- 2. The last Plague
 - a. This has huge significance
 - b. The children of Israel would have to be prepared

THE BEGINNING OF MONTHS

- 1 Now the LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying,
- **2** "This month shall be your beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year to you.

Exodus 12:1-2

- 1. This was so significant God determined its application
- 2. This was to be the beginning of the spiritual year for the nation of Israel

PREPARATION FOR THE PASSOVER

- **3** Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying: 'On the tenth of this month every man shall take for himself a lamb, according to the house of *his* father, a lamb for a household.
- **4** And if the household is too small for the lamb, let him and his neighbour next to his house take *it* according to the number of the persons; according to each man's need you shall make your count for the lamb.
- **5** Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year. You may take *it* from the sheep or from the goats.
- **6** Now you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of the same month. Then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it at twilight.

Exodus 12:3-6

- 1. The Household
 - a. A lamb for the household
 - b. Households can be combined
- 2. The lamb
 - a. First year
 - b. Sheep or Goat
 - c. To be without blemish
 - d. To be kept for 4 days

THE SLAYING OF THE LAMB

- **7** And they shall take *some* of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses where they eat it.
- **8** Then they shall eat the flesh on that night; roasted in fire, with unleavened bread and with bitter herbs they shall eat it.
- **9** Do not eat it raw, nor boiled at all with water, but roasted in fire—its head with its legs and its entrails.
- **10** You shall let none of it remain until morning, and what remains of it until morning you shall burn with fire.
- 11 And thus you shall eat it: with a belt on your waist, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. So you shall eat it in haste. It is the Lord's Passover.

Exodus 12:7-11

- 1. The lamb is to be slain
 - a. At twilight
 - b. Symbolic of the darkness that prevailed
- 2. The blood of the lamb
 - a. Its blood is to be applied
 - b. On the lintel and the doorposts
- 3. The meat of the lamb
 - a. It must be eaten
 - b. It must be roasted
 - c. The whole of the lamb must be consumed
- 4. How the Passover Meal is to be partaken of
 - a. Girded up fully
 - b. Ready to leave Egypt
 - c. It would take Faith to trust the LORD

THE LAST PLAGUE

12 'For I will pass through the land of Egypt on that night, and will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: I am the LORD.

13 Now the blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you *are*. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you; and the plague shall not be on you to destroy *you* when I strike the land of Egypt.

Exodus 12:12-13

- 1. Passing over the land of Egypt in the night
- 2. All the firstborn would be struck dead
 - a. Man
 - b. Beast
 - c. All the gods of Egypt
- 3. The Judgement of God
 - a. Forewarned
 - b. Fulfilled

REFLECTIONS

Last week at Youth Worship, we read about how the LORD gave the children of Israel instructions on how to prepare for the Passover. The LORD also depicted what would happen during the final plague, which was the death of every firstborn in Egypt, including Pharaoh's household.

Preparing for the Passover

cannot co-exist with sin.

Before the LORD could carry out the final plague, the children of Israel had to heed the specific instructions given by Moses, from the Lord Himself. Whether it was the manner of choosing the sacrificial lamb or partaking of the Passover meal, it had to be thoroughly prepared for and done according to how the LORD instructed. From this plan of redemption of the Israelites, we see how every detail was well-planned and very intentional on the LORD's part. He intended for the Israelites to be a part of His plan, and intended for them to respond with reverence and thankfulness to Him. This was meant to be a life-impacting experience for them!

Appreciating the work of salvation in a new light

Just like how the blood from the sacrificial lamb was a sign to God for Him not to strike the households of Israel with His wrath, the blood of Christ was enough to satisfy God's wrath for all sinners.

Because all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23), the only outcome for sin is judgement by God, as He is a righteous and holy God who

Yet, because the LORD loves and wants to have a relationship with us, He sent His Son the Lord Jesus Christ to earth to die for our sins, as He was the only acceptable Sacrificial Lamb to pay for all sins and satisfy God's wrath against all sinners. This alone awes me because the LORD's plan of salvation was so carefully and intentionally carried out, and it was meant to save ALL, not just the Jews, but the Gentiles as well. And it is because of this work of salvation that I am already made complete in Him (Colossians 2:10), and it is now on my part to actively relate to God and walk right before Him.

Challenge to have an intentional faith-life

Learning from the Scriptures and reflecting on the lessons taught have impacted me to also be more intentional whilst relating to God, and not going to Him only when it is convenient or out of dire need. I learnt the significance of planning to set aside time for God each day to meditate on His Word, and relate to Him in prayer. Whether it is to seek Him for daily cleansing or praising Him for who He is, I learnt how to relate to God intentionally. I saw this change in the way I served in church too, whether it was preparing my heart and spirit before beginning a time of worship, or ensuring I was thoroughly prepared to serve Him by practising how to read the Scriptures effectively. As I acknowledge God as the LORD of my life, I want to cultivate my heart and spirit and do my best for Him in service, as He deserves nothing but the best from me.
