REFLECTIONS

YOUTH WORSHIP REFLECTIONS

For the past few weeks, we have been studying the journey of the Israelites from the land of Egypt towards the promised land of Canaan. Through this journey, God tested the Israelites to see if they would "diligently heed the voice of the LORD [their] God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes." (Exodus 15:26) However, after the first test, the Israelites failed because instead of trusting the LORD, they turned to complaining. Last week, we learned about how the Israelites complained about not having meat and bread to eat. On the surface, they complained against Moses and Aaron, claiming that they brought them out of Egypt to die of starvation. The people had a selective memory and chose to forget the blessings and miracles God had provided for them not long before. However, God graciously provided for the people yet again, giving them manna and quails to eat in the mornings and evenings respectively.

Often, we too may respond like the Israelites when we are going through difficult times in life. However, it is important for us to remember that God has a greater plan for us in bringing us through these tough times. Like He did with the Israelites, God sometimes leads us through the 'wilderness' where we may have to endure hardships. Moreover, God is not unfair to us, and He also provides us with periods of respite after our trials, our challenge is to not only remember these times and be grateful to God for His provision but to learn the right lessons of faith and trust in God from them!

It is not easy to pass God's tests when we feel we are in a situation that seems insurmountable. Sometimes when schoolwork piles up and I don't understand what my teachers are teaching me, I catch myself acting like the Israelites, complaining about how much work I have in comparison to others or how bad my teachers are. I did not think much about this spirit of complaining that I had developed, thinking it was normal. After all, everyone around me seemed to be doing the same.

Yet after this lesson, I needed to reconsider what my complaints really reflect about my attitude. In complaining about the teachers I had, I was essentially complaining about the people God placed in my life to help guide me. Furthermore, as I complained about the work the school gave me, I was actually complaining about the school which God had graciously allowed me to enter after much prayer. I realised that I was no different from the Israelites—while I was complaining about my physical circumstances, I was complaining against God! This was a scary thought as I never thought of my simple act of complaining in this way.

Having learnt this lesson, my response is to seek to avoid complaining. Instead, I am trying to see God's presence with me each step of the way, thanking Him for all that He has done for me thus far. Just like how the Israelites needed to remember that God was with them, guiding them through the pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night, I need to remember that God is with me through all my struggles as well. Furthermore, I am also seeking to remember what God has blessed me with, and in doing so, I can bring my focus back to the Lord and be assured that if He has helped me in the past, He can help me in the present and the future!

With this lesson in mind, let us all seek to stop complaining when times are tough and instead have faith that God will lead us through our struggles!




If you need further assistance, please go to the registration booth at the Fellowship Hall on Sundays and we will assist you with the registration process.
