FEARFULLY & WONDERFULLY MADE SHERMAN AND ZARA SIM (PARENTS OF ELENA SIM)

We became a family of four when our daughter was born on 10 January 2024.

We decided on her name quite early on in the pregnancy. Her English name, Elena ("shining light"), reflects our hope that she will be a light to those around her. Her Chinese name, 睿祈(Rui Qi), reflects our intention for her to be guided in life by godly wisdom (睿) and prayer (祈).

It has only been two months since Elena was born, but as her parents, we have already had to lean into these very aspirations we have sought for her.

Unlike Zara's earlier pregnancy, this pregnancy was smooth and uneventful. As second-time parents, we also went about our preparations with the expectation that our experience with Isaac would stand us in better stead to care for the baby when she arrived.

However, much of our expectations and preparations were turned on its head the day after Elena was born, when she was diagnosed with having a cleft palate (a split in the roof of the mouth, which prevents her from sucking and swallowing normally). We were told that she would require surgery at 9 to 10 months old to correct this defect, as well as potential longer-term medical care for hearing and speech complications. In the meantime, she is unable to nurse like a normal baby, and requires special bottles and care to be taken for feeding.

As parents, we were naturally filled with pain and worry upon receiving the news. How would she cope with a 2+ hour long surgery at such a young age? What if there are indeed long-term side effects that would materially affect her quality of life in the future?

During those early days, our chief comfort came from God's Word. Psalm 139:13-14 reminded us that Elena was fearfully and wonderfully made by God. Her condition may be defined as a "defect" in medical terms, but there is nothing defective about her – she was made perfectly by God in accordance with His plan, and we can rest in the knowledge that He is sovereign and in control of all that she would face in life. We also thank God that we have the privilege of prayer, through which we can continually seek strength, wisdom and comfort from Him as we navigate Elena's condition.

As such, despite these early challenges, our hearts are filled with thankfulness and praise as we commit Elena to God in baptism. And there is indeed much to be thankful for – the provision of good doctors that led to early detection and intervention, and the immense care and support we have received from loved ones (including our dear Bethany family). There is also the blessing of Elena herself; who has been an immense source of joy to the family (especially Isaac!) and thus far lived up to her name as a bright spark in our lives. Above all, we are thankful for this faith that can carry us through as we face whatever the future holds for us, and for Elena. Our prayer is therefore that she too will come to know Him personally one day – the God that has seen her through her life's earliest challenges – and be a shining light for Him to those around her.



Early years

I received Christ in 2000, if the definition of it is saying the Sinner's Prayer.

The first two churches I attended were Charismatic. I was often in the midst of people speaking in tongues. I felt uncomfortable, out of place, and had doubts about myself, thinking I had been "left out" by the Holy Spirit.

The messages in the sermons often did not speak to me. The rock musicstyle worship got me a little "high", but the uplift was temporal and fizzled out as fast as it came about.

Soon I lost interest, and ultimately stopped attending church altogether.

Years away from church

I was in "spiritual wilderness" for 15 years. I didn't read the Bible much during the early church-going years, and more so during the years away from church. Deep down I wasn't even sure if I'll step into a church again.

However God has His plan to give us a future and a hope (Jeremiah 29:11).

Back to His Word

In 2022, my parents moved to stay with us. To my surprise, despite being away from church for such a long time, I felt an urge to share the Gospel with my parents.

"Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour in which the Son of Man is coming."

---Matthew 25:13

There was real urgency to have my parents know of the Lord. To share the Gospel, I found myself picking up the Bible again.

Through my parents, God has drawn me back to Him, which was truly amazing.

We attended a Hakka language church, hoping that the familiarity of the language would help in my parents' understanding of the Gospel. As a result, my wife and our children who do not understand the Hakka language, also attended the Hakka service.

Interestingly it was someone there who recommended Bethany to me. He reminded me not to neglect the spiritual walk of my wife and children.

Drawn to Bethany

On our first visit to Bethany, what struck me was the warmth of the brethren. Not just a few, but friendly greetings came from all around!

And I was amazed at how EVERYTHING, from the breakfast and fellowship lunch, to the cleaning up after the fellowship, was by our brethren. It reminded me of the early church of Jerusalem in Acts.

Special Needs Ministry

For our boy Howe Ten, I can't express enough of my appreciation to the Special Needs Ministry, who put in so much heart and creativity into the lessons.

So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

---Genesis 1:27

No one should be deprived of the good news of salvation, and the Special Needs Ministry's efforts towards this cause touch my heart immensely.

Since attending Sunday School in Bethany, Howe Ten would request to read a chapter of the Bible nightly, and this routine has greatly improved his reading ability, something which years of speech therapy wasn't able to achieve!

We thank God for gifting us with Howe Ten. Through Howe Ten, God has also nurtured a wonderfully caring sister in E-Xuan.

Through all these, we see how the works of God were revealed in Howe Ten (John 9:3).

Daily Devotionals

Previously I do not see much relevance of the Old Testament to my life, but Pastor Charlie's Daily Devotionals have drawn clear parallels for me to see:

Indeed He says,

'It is too small a thing that You should be My Servant

To raise up the tribes of Jacob,

And to restore the preserved ones of Israel;

I will also give You as a light to the Gentiles,

That You should be My salvation to the ends of the earth.'

——Isaiah 49:6

The Daily Devotionals drew my attention to the Messianic prophecies of the Old Testament, reminding me of God's unfailing love in sending His Servant to give us light and salvation.

Once slaves to sin, we were redeemed by Our Heavenly Father through Christ Jesus. This deeper appreciation of God's abundant grace has brought me much more peace and joy than before.

Sunday School

Sunday School with Pastor Mark, where we study Romans, has given me greater understanding of the strategy to deal with our daily struggle with sin, and what it means to be "alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:11).

His advice to "anticipate situations" has helped me greatly in averting potential conflicts in daily life, as it allowed me to turn to the Bible verses in my heart before my emotions could run riot.

Through Sunday School, I learned that to be baptised is to identify with

Christ our Lord and to walk in the newness of life that He has gifted me. This is my motivation to seek baptism.

The two December evenings

Last December, my family attended the memorial service and funeral of the late Mr Lam, conducted by Bethany's pastoral team. Mr Lam was my father's cousin.

Throughout the two evenings, I witnessed how our pastors were dedicated in serving our Lord, even into the late hours. I see youths like Jerome Lai sacrificing their time for the AV team. They all exemplified what it means to "serve the Lord with gladness" (Psalm 100:2).

I was deeply moved to learn that all these were done pro bono.

I have seen enough in the two evenings to tell myself: yes, Bethany is the church where I want to be a part of and to serve.

Even though my daughter and son-in-law invited me to Bethany Church on Sundays for some years now, I didn't join them. But I would come occasionally for special events, and that's how I first got introduced to Bethany.

After the Covid pandemic, when my daughter and her family started going back to church, they invited me again. This time, for some reason, I agreed. Looking back, it seems like this might have been what God has planned for me.


I settled down in Bethany pretty quickly, thanks to the friendliness and kindness of Mary and the wonderful friends I made here. They are very patient and nice, helping me feel at ease in Bethany.

From knowing nothing about the Bible, I started learning from teacher Mary during Sunday School class. I learned more about God's word from Pastor Moses during Chinese Worship and SSP. Friends from SSP always shared their beliefs with me. Through Joanna, I under-stood further how Jesus' sacrifice means eternal life to those who accept Him as their personal Saviour. I used to be quite anxious about life, but understanding more about God has brought a sense of peace and calmness to my heart. The words from Jesus in John 11:25, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live," always linger in my mind.

Ever since I believed in Jesus, I have stopped the practices I used to follow, that is, I no longer worship idols. In November 2023, my brother-in-law passed away. I respectfully informed my sister and relatives about my new religion, and I did not burn incense sticks anymore as I paid my last respect to the deceased.

In December 2023, I arrived at Changi Airport after a long flight from New Zealand. I nearly fell off and rolled down from the top of an escalator. I vaguely remember that when I lost my step and about to fall, the escalator seemed to have slowed down and stopped for a very brief moment. Because of that, the passengers who were in front of me, and my daughter who was behind me could quickly pulled me back to safety, thus prevented me from falling. After the incident, my daughter confirmed that the escalator did not stop at all. I believed that it was God who kept me safe, sending people to help me at that moment. I thanked God for that.

I would like to take this step of faith to be baptized, because I have come to realize that how great God is and how He has been good to me. I no longer carry the same anxieties and worries, because I have found salvation through Jesus.



My name is Lim Ah Lan. I am eighty-one years old. I have two sons and four grand-children. My parents did not have any religious beliefs, Therefore I grew up as a free thinker and I thought that all gods are the same and will teach me to be a good person. My husband's family worships idols and ancestors. As the eldest daughter-in-law, I too worshipped with my husband's family.



Hi, my name is Yeo Thiam Neo. (杨天娘). I was born on 6 March 1944 and I just celebrated my 80th birthday. It is my desire to be baptised when I reach 80 years old, and today, it is with great joy that I seek to be baptised, to identify with the Lord Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour.

Little joy in my early difficult years

I was born in Singapore and grew up in a large family with 5 brothers and 5 sisters. Life was hard as my father had to support a large family during the Japanese Occupation. As the 2nd eldest sister of the family, and when finances were tight, I was only educated until Primary 3, hence my limited knowledge of English. I had to take care of my younger siblings and only my younger sisters and youngest brother received full education till secondary school and university. My father passed away when he was 57 years old and my mum has to single-handedly raise our large family, with the help of the elder children. My mum was fortunate to live to a ripe old age of 92 years old.

I married at the age of 25 and had 3 sons (Jen Chung, Jen Cheang and Jen Chian). I was a homemaker and raising a growing family on the salary of my husband as a bank officer was tough. When the children were schooling, I had to take on various humble jobs such as being an office cleaner and a cai fan (economy rice) stall assistant just to supplement my husband's income and support the family. Working as an office cleaner in a Japanese company was not easy as I had to haul rubbish through multiple levels, cleaned all the washrooms and sometimes suffered condescending remarks and humiliating behaviour from unkind Japanese staff.

Finding joy in Christ

I grew up with ancestral and Buddhist worship as that was passed down to me as traditions. I did not really understand what I was worshipping and just participated during those festivals. When my second son and my youngest son Jen Chian went to church during their teenage years, I nagged but didn't stop them. Over the years, they tried to share their Christian faith with me but I didn't really pay attention. It was great to see that my late husband accepted Christ on his hospital bed as my second son's church friends (especially Jessica) shared the Gospel and prayed for him, just before he passed away.

As I got on in years, I was warded in hospital multiple times for various conditions. During those hospital stays, I had visits from my second son's church friends as well as friends from Bethany. I remember fondly the visits by Pastor Charlie, Aunty Sally, Deonna, Joanna, Patricia and a few others whom I cannot recall. Little did I realise that all those visits let me have a chance to catch a glimpse of this Christian faith and got to know a little more about the personal Saviour Jesus Christ whom they were sharing about.

Over the years, Jen Chian and Kelley invited me to Bethany to attend the Bilingual Worship as well as the church celebrations at Shangri-la which I enjoyed. Although I did not know many people in church, I was always greeted with warm smiles and greetings by the people I met. I also enjoyed the lunch very much whenever I come to church. I felt the warmth of God's love right here at Bethany. I also made friends with Dr Victor and Lay See who kindly visited me at home and also treated me to lunch and shared the Gospel with me.

God reached out to me in the evening years of my life. Slowly but surely, He opened up my heart to accepting His Son Jesus as my Lord and personal Saviour! When Jen Chian shared with me the story of how the Son of God, Jesus Christ, came down to earth to die for our sins, I was very moved because how can someone love me so much that He will die and hang on the cross for my sins? During the Christmas luncheon at Shangri-la last year, I shared openly with those at my table that I am very happy to believe in Jesus and I want to be baptised when I turn 80!

Treasuring this new-found joy in my life

Now that I have discovered this faith and found this joy in the Lord, I want to treasure Him! I look forward to coming to Bethany for Chinese Worship

every Sunday and listen to the messages and meeting new friends. During the week, I will read the Bible whenever I can. I was told that the Bible is the Word of God and how special it is that a God who loves me wants to speak to me through His Bible!

I have recently celebrated my 80th birthday and it is my heart's desire to be baptized today because I have found God real in my life as my Lord and Saviour. Thank God for His salvation and for this joy I have discovered through the Lord Jesus Christ!

Growing up and barriers to faith

For many years, I felt the love of God through learning about Him at many Family Camps and Youth Conferences, as well as through my family and other teachers in Bethany while interacting with them.

At the same time, I felt that I was not remorseful enough of my sins to accept Christianity like the Pastors, teachers, and adults have. I felt that my teachers were superior in some way because they were baptised, showed knowledge and eagerness for the Word, and expressed love for others unreservedly. It was difficult for me to overcome this doubt, but I accepted that faith and grace was wholly not about what I had done, but the Lord Jesus' actions instead. Meaning

Besides inconsistencies in seeking God through the Word and in prayer, my experiences of mistakes in school have shown me how weak I am individually. It is not easy to be responsible in most school or work assignments, and I inevitably fall short on many occasions. However, this is also one way I can see that my efforts are futile without God and His guidance. Complacency and pride in my own abilities is a sin that has led to failure and disappointment.

It may not be possible to address every doubt I have, but it sometimes takes a leap of faith to determine that what I have seen regarding faith is sufficient for me to choose it as the path I want to pursue. One of the strongest appeals for faith comes during times when I contemplate why I do what I do after experiencing a tough situation in school and NS, or thinking what comes after living our life (the existential crisis).

God's Word seems to offer the only satisfactory answer, in that I live to follow Christ, and there is no alternative to find our fundamental reason to live. I am glad and comforted that the written word provides answers to existential questions such as these.

"Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."

I am deeply grateful to my Sunday School Teachers and Pastors, having now understood some of the love of God they were trying to convey to all the young people in Bethany. This Easter, I understand that I can approach God in faith due to the grace He granted by sending the Lord Jesus to bear our sins. I seek to identify with Him to affirm my desire to live for Him, according to His teachings.



My name is Joshua and I'll be turning 25 this year. I graduated from university last year and began my first job at the end of last year. My parents, Peng Hui and Li Hong have raised me in Bethany, along with my brothers Caleb and Ethan. This upbringing has given me the privilege of learning from and getting to know many God-fearing and faithful individuals.

I've always appreciated this religious upbringing because it provided me with a moral compass that kept me out of trouble, and introduced me to a God that I could turn to in times of need. I understood the lessons taught at Sunday School and the sermons delivered during morning worship. I recognized the existence of God as my Creator and Jesus as the Saviour who died for my sins. Although I understood this, my personal faith felt weaker in comparison to others in my community.

As I matured, I felt that despite being immersed in a religious environment and consistently attending church, I didn't have a deep relationship and faith in the Lord. This was something that greatly frustrated me because I found it difficult to feel God's presence and felt distant from Him.

In Junior College, I began to place a greater emphasis on my academic results and professional aspirations. This brought upon a competitive mindset that helped me to stay focused but it was accompanied by a great deal of stress and anxiety. I also developed a bout of insomnia, which greatly affected my school performance and compounded my worries. I constantly felt that my results did not accurately reflect the amount of effort I was putting into my studies, and it was extremely discouraging when others would outperform me despite not studying as hard.

I learned to look towards the Lord for peace and comfort. One passage that my Mom would frequently remind me of was Joshua 1:9, which resonated deeply with me due to the book being my namesake. It reads "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be

discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." These words offered fleeting moments of peace amidst my struggles with feelings of inadequacy and concern for what the future held. Another verse that I would constantly remind myself of was Isaiah 55:8-9 which reads "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, Nor are your ways My ways,' says the Lord." This passage reminded me that God had a plan for me that was not yet revealed and I should have faith in His perfect wisdom. Despite understanding this, a part of me struggled to completely relinquish my worries, and I could not place my full trust in the Lord.

Even after my A' levels, my worrisome nature followed me into the army. I dealt with even more uncertainty about the future, especially thoughts about university admissions and my future career path. It was during this period of time that I desired a closer relationship with the Lord and I began cultivating a more deliberate prayer life.

Enforced lights out timings in the army coupled with my insomnia provided me with dedicated prayer time. I would pour out my heart to the Lord, sharing every concern and the various thoughts that often kept me awake. This dedicated time for prayer not only soothed my restless mind but also nurtured a deeper faith within me. Gradually, I learned to be more comfortable placing my trust in God, shifting my prayers from seeking specific outcomes to asking for the strength and faith to accept whatever path He had set for me.

As it reads in Matthew 7:7, "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you". In my younger days, I expected a deep relationship and faith by simply showing up at church and knowing Bible verses, to no avail. Only through a deliberate, purposeful effort to understand the Lord did His presence become clear to me.

I also thank God for the support from the community in Bethany. During that time, there were countless individuals who provided invaluable spiritual support, many of whom still do to this day. One such individual is Pastor Ben Quah, who was still a student/intern pastor at that time. While I was in the army, he graciously gifted me a book from the Bethany bookstore which contained a collection of short devotionals. One of the first devotionals that

I read from this book drew inspiration from Hebrews 11:8, which speaks of how Abraham was called to go to a place to receive his inheritance, and he went out, not knowing where he was going. The author even wrote "Have you been asking God what He is going to do? He will never tell you... He reveals to you who He is." The devotional perfectly captured my feelings at that time and addressed it through scripture.

In that moment, I felt as though God was speaking directly to me, commanding me to trust more and worry less. I began to shift my focus towards appreciating the blessings and protection that I've been granted.

I continued to experience tough situations and uncertainty in University, internships and work, but they never affected me as much as they used to. This was because I could look back and trace God's guiding hand through previous challenges, and recognize the countless and undeserved blessings He has granted me. Reflecting on those experiences has profoundly strengthened my faith in God. Psalm 116:1-2 encapsulates the attitude that I seek to have. It reads, "I love the Lord, because He has heard my voice and my supplications. Because He has inclined His ear to me, Therefore I will call upon Him as long as I live."

Having seen what God has done for me, seeking reaffirmation is my chosen response. I seek to be identified with Him and the Lord Jesus Christ. It also represents my commitment to walk in faith and live the new life that He has given me.



Introduction

Hi everyone, my name is Jared and I am 18 years old this year. Growing up, I have had the privilege of being a part of Bethany and I can gladly say that my fondest memories have been made in Bethany with God's people. Today, it is my great joy to share with you how I came to faith in the Lord Jesus and about how good God has been to me all my life.

A Theoretical Faith

My faith journey begins from my childhood, in which I was constantly showered with knowledge of God and my salvation through the Lord Jesus Christ. I listened to countless stories from the Bible, so much so that I knew them like the back of my hand. I attended Sunday School and Worship services every week, answering all the questions I could, I prayed every day, and I even sought to live my life well, according to the Bible. On the outside, it seemed like I was the model Christian, yet on the inside I did not understand faith at all.

My Response

Seeing how much God has done for me in my life, I recognise that the least I can do is to give my life to Him and seek to live for Him, not because I am trying to earn my salvation, but because I am so grateful to Him for all that He has done for me. Today, I seek to be reaffirmed to

cement my commitment to the Lord Jesus and declare to all that I have found a true and genuine faith in a most wonderful and loving God that has saved me from sin and given me eternal life!



Hello everyone! My name is Asia Tan and I am turning 20 this year. It is with great joy and privilege that I share my reaffirmation testimony with you all today.

I thank God for a loving and God-fearing family who have faithfully brought me to Bethany since I was born. Growing up, I attended Creche, Sunday School, Children's Worship, and many of Bethany's programs, and was constantly fed the Word of God from a young age.

However, I struggled with comprehending the reality of God on a deeper level, given that my faith was largely a theoretical one that revolved around Biblical stories and characters. It always seemed like the Lord was a faraway higher being that I had difficulty "accessing", and it was challenging for me to understand that my relationship with Him was meant to be a personal one, where He could be directly involved in my life. When sharing about my struggles, I remember being encouraged by Matthew 7:7 which reads, "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you". I prayed that the Lord would gradually reveal Himself to me as I continued to pursue my walk of faith.


Sure enough, the Lord did exactly that as I encountered many of life's obstacles in my growing-up years. The first occurred at age 13 when I was diagnosed with pre-puberty scoliosis. As a ballerina, this news took a big hit on me as the deterioration of my condition would entail major surgery and the potential loss of my entire dance career. I remember vividly many nights of tears, and praying for Him to have mercy on me, and strength to endure the painful brace-wearing process for almost 1.5 years. Fast forward to my

post-puberty checkup, my condition had not deteriorated one bit! I cannot but attribute this miracle to His matchless grace for seeing me through, and I am a living testimony of God's deliverance through tumultuous times.

The next would be a common challenge that many Singaporean teenagers face - the terrifying A levels, and even more scarily, what happens after. 2022-2023 were daunting years for me as I sat through the A levels, received my results, and had to make important decisions on which University to go to to chart the next stage of my life. During this time, I prayed for the Lord's wisdom and strength to guide and preserve me, and my encouragement was found in 2 Timothy 1:7 "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind." Even on days when I felt lost, The Lord provided His wisdom and help through my family who always gave me the best advice, my friends who were my source of emotional support, and the Bethany family who voluntarily kept me in prayer. Abiding in the Lord also brought a special sense of peace, as I knew that as long as I put my best foot forward, I could trust that the Lord had a greater purpose and plan for me. Now, looking back, I can testify of His hand and provision every step of the way, and speak of God's goodness and faithfulness in guiding and leading me through uncertain times.

Through my past 20 years of life, I can only look back in awe of the blessings and the goodness the Lord has so graciously extended to me. Today, I seek reaffirmation knowing that I have found a loving God to be my personal Saviour and Father, and my response is to want to stand firm in the faith and dedicate my life to Him. I will seek to be a living testimony of His love as I strive to use this little life of mine to bring glory to His wondrous name.
