
## **COME AND WORSHIP**



Let us review what we have learnt at our last Youth Worship!

#### YWS MESSAGE - 9 MARCH 2024 "NOW I KNOW THAT THE LORD IS GREATER THAN ALL THE GODS" EXODUS 18:11

#### INTRODUCTION

- 1. Moses in Egypt
  - a. He went to Egypt alone
  - b. His wife and his two sons remained in Midian
- 2. Jethro visited Moses
  - a. Jethro visited Moses
  - b. He also brought his two grandchildren with him

#### THE VISIT

- **1** And Jethro, the priest of Midian, Moses' father-in-law, heard of all that God had done for Moses and for Israel His people—that the LORD had brought Israel out of Egypt.
- **2** Then Jethro, Moses' father-in-law, took Zipporah, Moses' wife, after he had sent her back.
- **3** with her two sons, of whom the name of one *was* Gershom (for he said, "I have been a stranger in a foreign land")
- **4** and the name of the other was Eliezer (for he said, "The God of my father was my help, and delivered me from the sword of Pharaoh");

**5** and Jethro, Moses' father-in-law, came with his sons and his wife to Moses in the wilderness, where he was encamped at the mountain of God.

**6** Now he had said to Moses, "I, your father-in-law Jethro, am coming to you with your wife and her two sons with her."

#### Exodus 18:1-6

- 1. Jethro
  - a. He was a priest of Midian
  - b. He was the father-in-law of Moses
- 2. Reconciliation
  - a. Moses had sent Zipporah back to her father
  - b. She went with her two sons
  - c. Jethro sought to reconcile the family
- 3. The sons of Moses
  - a. Gershom (A stranger)
  - b. Eliezer (God is my help)
- 4. The family was reconciled

#### THE TESTIMONY OF MOSES

- **7** So Moses went out to meet his father-in-law, bowed down, and kissed him. And they asked each other about *their* well-being, and they went into the tent.
- **8** And Moses told his father-in-law all that the LORD had done to Pharaoh and to the Egyptians for Israel's sake, all the hardship that had come upon them on the way, and *how* the LORD had delivered them.

Exodus 18:7-8

- 1. The Respectful attitude of Moses
  - a. Bowed down
  - b. Kissed his father-in-law
  - c. Exchange of greetings
- 2. Moses' sharing of what God had done
  - a. What God had done to Pharaoh
  - b. What God had done to Egypt
  - c. What God had done for Israel
  - d. The hardship that Israel had experienced in the wilderness
  - e. How the LORD had delivered them

#### THE RESPONSE OF JETHRO

**10** And Jethro said, "Blessed be the LORD, who has delivered you out of the hand of the Egyptians and out of the hand of Pharaoh, and who has delivered the people from under the hand of the Egyptians.

11 Now I know that the LORD is greater than all the gods; for in the very thing in which they behaved proudly, He was above them."

**12** Then Jethro, Moses' father-in-law, took a burnt offering and *other* sacrifices to *offer* to God. And Aaron came with all the elders of Israel to eat bread with Moses' father-in-law before God.

Exodus 18:10-12

YOUTH WORSHIP REFLECTIONS

## ESTHER TANG

Two weeks ago, we learnt about the testimonies given by Moses and his father-in-law, Jethro.

Moses' testimony was a remembrance testimony, whereas Jethro's testimony was a response testimony. Through this lesson, we learnt how a testimony can have a great impact on others, and even bring them to faith.

#### **Moses' Testimony**

Moses gave his testimony to honour the Lord for His protection and provision over Israel, and for His deliverance. Moses did not take credit for the Lord's deliverance, and placed the focus of his testimony on the Lord. Moses was also candid about the struggles that he faced while leading the children of Israel, but his focus continued to be on the Lord.

#### **Jethro's Response**

Upon hearing the remembrance testimony of Moses, Jethro replied with a response testimony. Jethro, being a religious leader, acknowledged the greatness of the Lord and responded to it. He rejoiced for all the good that the Lord had done for Israel and blessed the Lord.



He saw that the Lord is above all of the gods that he had used to worship. Furthermore, Jethro also chose to respond by giving worship to the Lord. His worship came from a new-found faith, and he took a burnt offering and other sacrifices to offer to the Lord, and fellowshipped with Agron, Moses and all the elders of Israel.

The change in Moses and Jethro's relationship

As a result of Jethro's coming to faith, Jethro and

Moses' relationship was no longer just a father-in.

Moses' relationship was no longer just a father-inlaw and son-in-law relationship, but also a relationship found in the Lord, in the same faith. Their relationship where they could both recognise the greatness of the Lord allowed them to enhance their worship of the Lord.

#### My Challenge

As a 16-year old, I often find it difficult and challenging to share my faith with my friends, especially friends in school who do not share the same faith as me. But after hearing and learning this lesson, I am challenged to have the courage to bear witness of my faith in the Lord. I want to be able to speak of my faith candidly and personally, and to declare what the Lord has done for me and my family. The Lord has been my strength and my shield, and I am challenged to share His greatness with those ground me.



## JEROME LAI

#### Recap

2 weeks ago at Youth Worship, we learnt from Exodus 18:1-12 where Jethro (Moses' father-in-law) came to visit Moses who gave a testimony of God's deliverance and goodness towards the Israelites during their exodus out of Egypt.

#### Moses' Testimony of God's redemptive work

In Moses' testimony, we see how he recognised God's faithfulness in preserving the Israelites when they escaped Egypt and journeyed through the wilderness. Three things can be noted in Moses' testimony.

Firstly, Moses recognised God's hand in the protection of the Israelites. He told Jethro about 'all that the LORD had done' (Exodus 18:8). Moses did not take credit for bringing the Israelites out of Egypt, but instead remembered God's protection and provision for them from the very start and throughout.

Secondly, Moses acknowledged how God did everything for the Israelites because they were His people. He told Jethro that God did it all 'for Israel's sake' (Exodus 18:8), which reminds us that God sets apart His people and specially delivers them.

Thirdly, Moses was candid about the challenges which the Israelites faced. Moses acknowledged the many hardships which the Israelites had to go through, but he did not complain and instead focused wholly on the LORD's goodness and deliverance of the Israelites despite their tribulations.

#### **Jethro's Rejoicing**

Moses' testimony of the LORD was greatly encouraging to Jethro as we read about how Jethro 'rejoiced for all the good which the LORD had done for Israel, whom He had delivered out of the hand of the Egyptians' (Exodus 18:9). Jethro even responded with a personal statement of the LORD and gave a burnt offering and other sacrifices to God.

#### **Lessons To Learn**

I seek to personally apply 2 lessons from this text.

Firstly, I want to be able to testify of the LORD as Moses did. Just as Moses saw God's hand in protecting the Israelites, I too want to recognise God's hand in my everyday-life. In the mundane routine of school life, I may not easily see God's goodness shown to me. However, as I take the time to reflect, I see God's hand evident in my daily life - the strength given to complete my homework, tutorials and lectures assigned each day, the peace I can find from trusting in His Word, the loving Bethany community and family at home, and so much more. He gives all these abundantly as I am part of His people and this is a special truth that I want never to forget. Entering JC this year has been a continuous struggle, with much longer schedules and heavier workloads. Almost naturally,

I often turn to complaining and worrying. But this lesson serves as a reminder to me, that even in my struggles I can rejoice and be grateful for everything God has provided and done for me and that He will continue to uphold me till the end.

Secondly, I want to rejoice in the LORD with others of the same faith. As Jethro was encouraged by Moses' testimony of God, we can encourage each other here in Bethany by relating to one another through a common faith and joy in God. A verse which encapsulates this idea for us to come together is taken from Psalm 133:1 which reads 'Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!' which we learnt from the recent Family Camp. At Camp, I greatly enjoyed relating to others through a shared faith in God, even to people whom I had never met. I hope to relate more to fellow Christians here in Bethany through a shared faith, such as during the fellowship meals and programmes every week. May we all seek to be encouraged by the common faith that we all have, and ultimately rejoice in God!

Food became scarce and many feared starvation.






# NO YW NEXT WEEK (30 MARCH 2024)
