My name is Estee. I first came to Bethany through the introduction of my sister, Emma, some twenty years ago.

4. I also learnt that from our many prayers we received hope, comfort, and confidence in facing our problems but what shall we render to God for all his benefits towards us? I quote Pastor Charles’ poetry on Forget Not All His Benefits:

Our hearts would be enriched by the Lord.
We would find a healthier attitude towards life;
Even when the circumstances are full of strife

Guided by all this knowledge, I’m now more prepared to be a servant to the Lord and call myself a Christian. I feel blessed and I found warm friendships

in Bethany who are prepared to go out of their ways to give a helping hand. I feel honoured to be a member of Bethany!

With Pastor Charles and the strong Pastoral team, I know my faith in the Lord Jesus Christ will continue to be strengthened and grow. Thank you, Lord, for bringing me to Bethany.



My name is Esther. Many of you may know me as Nancy's daughter. Some of the older members may also remember me, as I am not new to Bethany IPC.

Today, I am seeking baptism this Easter and stepping forward in faith to be part of the Bethany IPC family – after a very long journey. How long, you may wonder? It has been **33 years** since I first came to Bethany in 1993.

I was introduced to Christianity from a young age, as I attended Christian schools from kindergarten through secondary school. However, the foundations of my faith were truly built here at Bethany. Through Sunday School and the many church camps I attended over the years, I learned about God's love and the importance of having faith in Him. Looking back now, I can see that during those years of learning and worship, God had already planted a seed in my heart.

However, despite having such a strong foundation when I was young, I was not prepared for the possibility of backsliding. When I entered tertiary school in Perth, my faith began to drift. Living in another country came with many challenges – adjusting to a new school system and being away from my family. The only comfort was that my sister chose to follow me to Perth so that I would not be alone.

At that time, we attended services at Bethel but we slowly began to make excuses not to attend. We told ourselves that the church was too far away, or that we needed time to explore Perth and adapt to the culture. We also convinced ourselves that missing one Sunday would not matter, as long as we still believed in the Lord Jesus Christ.

But one Sunday turned into once a month. Eventually, after my sister left Perth after six months, I only attended church when I felt like it.

Later, when Pastor Chris began leading the church and I started to enjoy the services, I still found myself prioritising other things. Spending time with friends became more important than going to church. After I graduated and started working, the same pattern continued – except that work replaced friends as my main priority.

Even though those years when I was not attending church, I would occasionally remember the Lord. I would sometimes pray when I was in danger, or when I felt sad after losing a loved one. But after praying and feeling comforted, I would slowly return to my old ways again.

Everything began to change on **24 November 2024**. My mother had fractured her leg in October, and after more than a month of rest, she wanted to return to church but needed someone to drive her. That Sunday, I accompanied her to Bethany.

What Pastor Charles shared that day truly struck a chord in my heart. The message was about *“He will not fail nor be discouraged.”* The teaching about finding joy and endurance in our faith, and not allowing our faith to grow weary, reminded me that through God’s love he would encourage us to find joy and to endure any struggles, and also should never take His love for granted.

From that day on, **Hebrews 12:2-3** stayed in my heart, especially whenever I

felt discouraged. I began turning to prayer more often.

I also found myself wanting to learn about God's love again and to renew my faith in Him. To a point, I even asked my mum if she would like to attend Family Camp with me. This took her by surprised as I had just recently started attending church again, but for me, it brought a sense of joy because I knew I wanted to learn how to truly seek the Lord.

Since returning to the Lord, I have spent time reflecting on how He never forsook. Instead, through his love, He continued to nurture the seed He had planted in my heart through many subtle reminders.

One of these reminders was a children's song called **"The Donut Song."** I first learned this song when I attended Bethany as a child, and it became one of my favourite songs. The catchy tune and the image of a sweet pastry made it easy to remember. Over the years, this song would occasionally come back to my mind as I owned a cassette tape of this song.

But during Family Camp in 2025, the meaning of the song truly struck me. The lyrics say:

"Life without Jesus is like a donut,
Like a donut, like a donut,
Life without Jesus is like a donut,
'Cause there's a hole in the middle of your heart."

Hearing these words again reminded me how empty my life was without the Lord. For many years, I drifted through life thinking everything would be fine on my own.

But now that I have learned to seek the Lord again, I want to continue growing in my faith with the Bethany family. I pray that the Lord will fill that empty "donut hole" in my heart so that my life will be filled with Him.



A LOVE LIKE NO OTHER

My name is Jamie, I am 20 years old this year and I am currently studying Early Childhood Education at SUSS.

For context, growing up, I did not come from a Christian background, and I did not understand the Word of God as a child. When I entered Junior College, by God's grace, I was surrounded by Christian friends and God's Word was a common topic amongst conversations and we even had worship in school assemblies. This made me more interested to know God's Word more and I started reading the Bible from then. However, reading the Bible by myself, I often had a lot of questions that I could not answer myself and even when I could understand some verses, my knowledge was surface level and I was severely lacking in depth. Hence, I knew I needed to go beyond just reading the Bible with my own interpretation.

This was when my friend invited me to Bethany, a church that revolves around God's Word. When I came to Bethany, everyone was so warm and welcoming to me, it really made me feel so much love and joy in church and I am grateful for God who sends His people my way to help me. These people include my Sunday School teacher, pastors and many other teachers who have taught me more about the Word of God. I was able to get my questions answered and I was able to learn more about the Word of God at a deeper level.

In 2025, after receiving my A level results and before receiving university placements, I had not done as well as what I had expected and this left me feeling as if my whole world was shattered. As a result, I was very disappointed in myself, I was often feeling down and uncertain about the

future. To me, life started becoming bleak and it was hard for me to be optimistic. However, I was always able to turn to the Lord to pray and abide in Him. Even though I felt burdened, God was always there to hear my sorrows and He was always there to comfort me. Even though the future felt so blurry to me, I knew I could trust in the Lord's plan for me. Jeremiah 29:11 says, "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the LORD, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope." This verse deeply resonated in me and gave me hope to endure the season of uncertainty. I have profound trust in Him that no matter life's challenges and uncertainty, God's plan for us is good and His plan is the best for us. Looking back now, it is truly God who knows us best. My name is Joyce Sng, wife of Thomas Teo and mother of Asher Teo. 9 years ago, my life changed when I learnt that my son, Asher, has autism. During that period, I was overwhelmed with questions, fears and uncertainty about what the future would hold.

The door to Christianity opened when I was introduced to Bethany IPC by Jewel, who was Asher's occupational therapist. What began as a simple invitation became the beginning of a life-changing journey.

When I first came to church, I was searching for comfort and strength. As a mother, I felt the weight of wanting to do everything right for my son, yet knowing I couldn't control everything. Through worship, learning God's Word, and the love of this church family, I slowly began to understand that I was not alone. God was with me in my fears, in my tears, and in my questions.

Over time, my faith became personal. I came to know the Lord Jesus Christ not just as a name, but as my Savior and my steady foundation. God rescued me from fear and gave me hope; as Psalm 34:4 says, "I sought the LORD, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears." He is my Lord because I have learnt to surrender my plans and trust Him, resting in the promise of Romans 8:28: "And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose." He is my Anchor in uncertainty, my Strength when I am weak, and my Peace when my heart is anxious. On the hardest days, He has carried me. On the joyful days, He has reminded me that every good gift comes from Him.

Raising Asher has taught me patience, perseverance, and unconditional love. Through him, I have seen glimpses of God's grace in ways I never expected. I am especially grateful to all the teachers in the Special Needs Ministry,

whose care, encouragement, and dedication have made such a difference in our lives. They have shown me the beauty of community and God's love for every child and family.

I am also deeply thankful for Pastor Mark, whose Sunday classes I attend. Through his faithful teaching of God's Word, I have grown in understanding, conviction, and confidence in my faith. I am grateful for his patience, wisdom, and commitment to lead us by God's truth. His guidance has helped me understand God's Word and apply God's truth to my daily life, especially during seasons of doubt and uncertainty.

Over these years, Bethany IPC has become more than just a place I attend. It has become my spiritual home. Here, I have experienced genuine love, support, and Biblical teaching that has helped me grow in my faith. I want to continue growing in Christ within this church family, to serve where I can, and to raise my son in a community that guides him to God's love and truth.

Today, I choose to be baptised as an expression of my faith in Jesus Christ and my commitment to follow Him wholeheartedly. God has transformed my fear into faith, my uncertainty into trust, and my weakness into dependence on Him.

I am grateful for the journey that brought me to Bethany IPC - for my son, for Jewel's invitation, for the Special Needs Ministry, for Pastor Mark, and for a God who opened the door to a new life in Christ.



KEEPING THE FAITH IN GOD'S LEADING

My name is Thomas - husband of Joyce, father of Asher.

Young and Indifferent

I learned about Christianity in primary school when I was in the Boy Brigade (BB). Bible study in BB was about passing the test and earning the badge, without understanding. It is about earning the promotion in BB.

In my teenage years, I saw my grandparents grappling with old age. They accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as their Saviour and were baptised in their twilight years. They passed years later. Questions about life and death, beliefs and religions became of interest. I attended a charismatic church which I did not feel comfortable.

As I was learning about Christianity, I could recall protection from God. In one of the military exercises overseas, I had an acute asthmatic attack during a thunderstorm. The rain was extremely heavy and visibility poor. I prayed to God at my wit's end. He answered my prayer - I received help and somehow there was an inhaler at the Company Sergeant Major's vehicle. I survived the episode, thank God for His mercy and protection.

Between university and working life, I drifted and de-prioritised God. It was all about earthly pursuit. There were a lot of business travel as I look for real estate opportunities for investors. When Asher was born, I merely took one day leave and headed back to work.

A Father's Turning Point

I was an uninvolved dad. As Asher slowly grew from an infant to about two years old, there were abnormalities that mummy observed. Asher lacked eye-contact and was non-verbal. He was about three years old when diagnosed with autism.

That was life changing. Joyce and I were devastated. Dreams and expectations were shattered. I worried about his future and questioned God on all that had happened.

In God's timing I was led back to church. In late 2017, we attended Bethany IPC at the invitation of Joyce's friend, Jewel. At the start, Asher was hard to manage in Sunday Special Needs Ministry (SNM), taking the lift up and down and roaming around. Thank God for the love and understanding from all the teachers in SNM under the leadership of teachers Milton and Shiao Yi. Asher gradually adapted and improved. As Asher was growing up, there were difficult times such as the closing down of the early intervention centre he attended and the primary school admission assessment. We constantly prayed for God's Hand. One after another hurdle, we prayed and trusted God's leading. God lit the path when we were in darkness.

We experienced the love and encouragement from brethren in Bethany. I witnessed God's people serving. I experienced the dedicated teachings from Pastor Mark and Mitch, based firmly on the Scripture. During COVID times, teachers Davina and Leanne continued with the weekly Sunday school for Asher via zoom as I attended the zoom session conducted by Pastor Mark and Mitch.

Faith in God and God's Everlasting Love

Through our learning of God's Word and the challenges we faced, I began to see that God was present—even when I did not fully understand. In this journey, I came to know our Lord Jesus Christ is real, He is my Lord and Saviour. I learned that trusting God does not mean having all the answers, but choosing to place my faith in Him daily. Christ has taught me humility, stillness, patience, and perseverance, and He has given me peace in moments when overwhelmed.

Spiritual Walk with Bethany

I am encouraged by the teaching of Romans 5:1-5. I learned that believers are justified by faith. Through faith in the Lord Jesus, we have access to God's grace and would be able to rejoice in the hope of the glory of God in

face of trials and tribulations. This serves as a reminder of the power of faith in the midst of challenges. It is a testament of enduring love and grace of God, available to all who believe.

From John 3:16-17, God's love is exceedingly greater than all. This journey of being Asher's dad has reshaped my understanding of love. It has taught me to see beyond my own expectations and love for Asher. This paled in comparison in God's love for us through the Lord Jesus Christ who died for our sins. Through Asher, God has shown me that His grace is sufficient and that His plans are greater than mine.

Thank you, Bethany IPC, Pastor Charles, Pastor Mark and the Pastoral team for the spiritual learning. I am grateful for the Pastoral team, leaders, teachers and SNM teachers who have demonstrated what true faith is about. This Easter, I look forward to remembering Christ who had sacrificed for us and risen, so that we can be saved. I put my trust in God to walk with us through every season. I look forward to my journey of faith with Bethany in deepening my spiritual relationship with God.
