INTRODUCTION

1. Deuteronomy 32 is also called “The Song of Moses”
2. It is not the Song he composed when God led Israel through the Red Sea and destroyed the Egyptian army Exodus 15
3. This Song served the following purposes:
 - a. Cautionary Instruction
 - b. Candid Insights
 - c. Challenging Aspiration

YOUTH WORSHIP REFLECTIONS

Hello everyone! Welcome back to Youth Worship. I hope everyone had a wonderful Easter celebration last week! It was an absolute joy spending Easter with the youths in Bethany, singing songs to God and rejoicing that the Lord Jesus has risen! I really enjoyed the time of fellowship with the younger girls at my lunch table and I hope you too had a memorable time of fellowship with those seated at your table.

Last week at Youth Worship, we learnt from Deuteronomy 32:1-6 which records the Song of Moses. He was commanded by God to write a song for the children of Israel so that it may be a witness for God's goodness and against the children of Israel (Deuteronomy 31:19).



The Consciousness of Moses

As Moses wrote the song for God (Deuteronomy 32), he had to be very conscious and scrupulous about what he was going to write about. This song must uphold God's glorious name and speak of His goodness and provision that had seen the children of Israel from the very beginning.

Proclaiming God's Name

Recorded in Deuteronomy 32:3-5, Moses proclaimed God's name, ascribing glory to His greatness. His attributes reminded me of how God was constantly faithful towards Israel even when they had sinned against Him. God showed Israel His amazing love and this was not to be taken for granted! God has every right to be honoured and glorified for His constant faithfulness!



In My Own Life

In a similar vein, when I look at my own life, I was definitely not exempted from God's faithfulness too. Easter reminds me of the sacrifice that God has made through His Son which is the epitome of His faithfulness towards us. I am a sinner who is so undeserving of God's grace.

However, because of God's faithfulness, He displayed the ultimate form of love towards us that is beyond any human love and it was through His Son, the Lord Jesus.

How heartening it is to know that our God loves us so much that He would send His only Son to be a propitiation for our sins (1 John 4:10) so that we can have a personal relationship with Him! We are deeply privileged to receive God's faithfulness in such a special way and this truly cannot be taken for granted.



Our Response

As we reflect on God's faithfulness towards us, we must respond in an appropriate manner. May we respond like Moses, with great consciousness of God! We must be conscious that we are full of sin and it is only because of the Lord Jesus' sacrifice that we are able to have a personal connection with God. As we continue on with our daily lives, we must always remember that where we are today is only because of God's faithfulness towards us. Hence, may we never take God's faithfulness for granted and as we sing the songs in worship or at our own time, may we take the time to reflect on the lyrics, to proclaim His name and always be reminded of His faithfulness in our hearts!



YOUTH WORSHIP REFLECTIONS

Hello everyone, and welcome back to Youth Worship! Two weeks ago, we studied from Deuteronomy 32:1–6, reading about the Song of Moses, where he used it to provide cautionary instruction, candid insights, and challenging aspirations to the children of Israel.

The strong sense of purpose within Moses

In writing this song, Moses did not do so thoughtlessly. Rather, it was written with full awareness of what he wanted to convey. It was through developing a great sense of consciousness that he was able to write the song in a manner that was refreshing while bringing an uplift to those who heard it. With this consciousness, he magnified the Lord's name, remembering all that the Lord had done for them.

The reality of the spiritual state of the children of Israel

In the Song of Moses, a reproach was given with regard to the spiritual state of the children of Israel. Their corruption, perversity, and wickedness were highlighted, and Moses called for them to remember the Lord as Father, as Redeemer, and as the One who establishes.

My Challenge

After learning this lesson, I was driven to examine the state of my faith candidly. I often find myself thinking that “everything is okay” when it comes to my faith, but I see how this could result in turning a blind eye to sins I struggle with, and instead of dealing with them, I unconsciously allow these sins to become a part of me—whether it be laziness, or the way I treated people around me, especially my family. As I started my J2 year, I found myself being distracted by many different things—friends, academics, and CCA. I felt like I was struggling to juggle all the different commitments I had, and instead of seeking the Lord amidst it all, I tried to handle everything on my own. However, it was through the lessons I learned that I realised I could not do it on my own.

Upon reflection, I saw how I was slowly losing sight of what was truly important to me—growing in my faith. This realisation made me want to change how I approach this year. I want to have a greater consciousness of the Lord—to be able to see that I am only able to go through each day because of the strength given by the Lord! I've begun seeking to cultivate a greater awareness of what I struggle with, and I've come to see that this begins with setting aside my pride, to accept sound advice from others, to accept criticism, rather than thinking that my way is the best.

I know that it will undoubtedly be challenging, but I can find hope in the Lord's strength each day— through starting each day with prayer and devoting time to reading His Word. I want to let Him guide the way I face my challenges, because I know that His plans are far greater than any plans that I can make for myself.
