
HEAR THE CALL OF THE KINGDOM

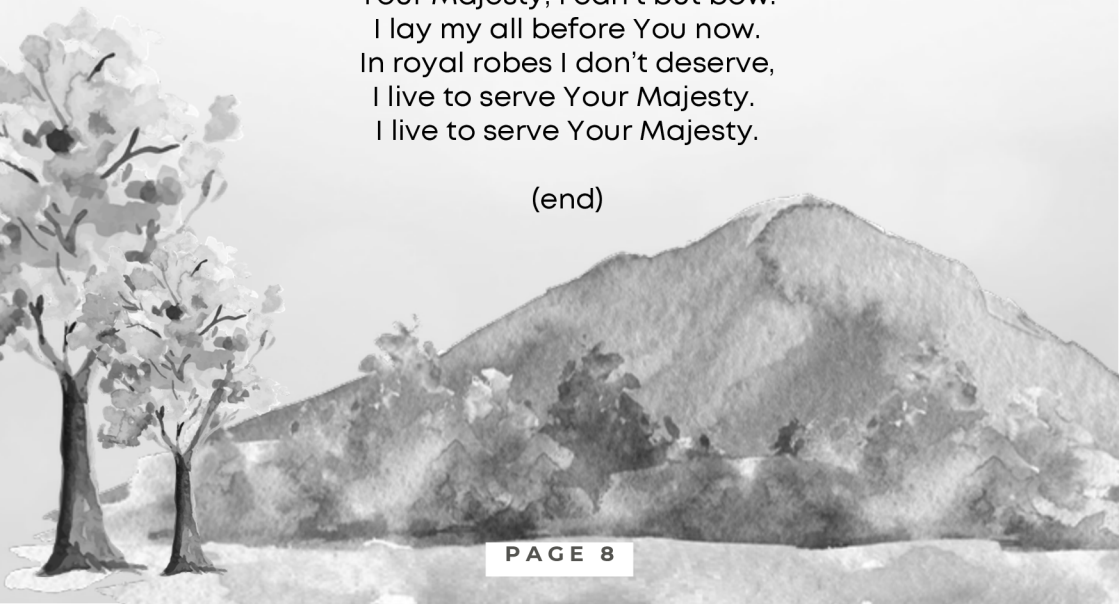
King of kings, Majesty,

Now this is the blessing with which Moses the man of God blessed the children of Israel before his death. Deuteronomy 33:1

1. This word was uttered as a prayer of blessing from Moses
2. It was spoken before his death

THE OPENING WORDS OF MOSES' PRAYER OF BLESSING

² *And he said:*

*“The LORD came from Sinai,
And dawned on them from Seir;
He shone forth from Mount Paran,
And He came with ten thousands of saints;
From His right hand
Came a fiery law for them.*

³ *Yes, He loves the people;
All His saints are in Your hand;
They sit down at Your feet;

YOUTH WORSHIP REFLECTIONS

Hello everyone! Welcome back to Youth Worship! Last week, we studied from Deuteronomy 33:1-5, where we learnt about Moses's final prayer of blessing for the people of Israel before his imminent death. In the opening words of his prayer, Moses recalled God's goodness and greatness, and His kingship and love demonstrated towards His own people. Moses did not just take time to remember the important events of the past 40 years, but rather, as he looked back, what stood out most to him was the constant abiding Presence of the LORD for him and Israel.

Moses began by recollecting how the LORD came in glory from Sinai, and through Seir, and Mount Paran, and He was accompanied by ten thousands of saints. He reminded Israel of the fiery law given at Sinai, entrusted to the congregation of Jacob. He also highlighted God's love, where His people were held in His hand, sitting at His feet to receive His Word. Finally, he affirmed that God is King in Jeshurun, reigning over the leaders and tribes gathered together under Him.

Remembering God's Presence and Glory

This passage reminds me that God's Presence has always been with His people, through every stage of their journey. Similar to how Israel experienced His Presence, I too need to remember that God's Presence is constant in my life, whether it be in seasons of difficulty or blessing. It is so easy to forget, to get caught up in my daily routines, distractions, or even successes throughout the week. These small lapses can grow into a cycle that can draw me away from Him and make me lose sight of what is most important.

When Moses reminded Israel of God's glory, he was urging them to anchor their faith in God. Above all the signs and wonders, it was the LORD that mattered the most - His Presence, His Love, and His Word. In the same way, I need to cultivate a habit of being conscious of the LORD Himself and His Presence.

Receiving God's Word with Joy

The image of God's people sitting at His feet to receive His Word challenges me to treasure the Scriptures. We can take the Word for granted and treat it lightly, or even allow distractions to take priority, rushing through reading or letting other tasks crowd it out. But Moses's prayer turns me back to the idea that God's Word is not just instruction, but rather, a gift, a living heritage passed down through generations.

Receiving His Word with joy means more than simply hearing it, it means welcoming it into my heart with gratitude, letting it take root, and allowing it to transform my thoughts and actions. It means that my choices, my service, and my devotion are not about convenience, but offering acts of worship to our Holy God who deserves praise and honour. He is the King in our lives, and the way I serve should reflect a heart of faithfulness and humility towards Him.

YOUTH WORSHIP REFLECTIONS

Welcome back to Youth Worship! Last week's text was taken from Deuteronomy 33:1-5, which focused on the start of Moses' final prayer. Pastor Ben Chong asked us a question: If we had to make our final prayer, how would we pray? What would we pray about? We can learn from the example of Moses who shows us that the main focus of prayer should be on the Lord.

A Consciousness of God

Moses was extremely conscious of what he should pray about. His thoughts were solely focused on the Lord. He traced the Lord's presence with Israel as they travelled through the wilderness from the time at Mount Sinai, all the way to almost entering the Promised Land. God was ever present with them, as a pillar of cloud or fire, with the provision of manna to the children of Israel and in so many other ways. The Lord's presence and protection were undeniable and Moses remembered this.



This got me thinking about what I am conscious about when I pray. A lot of times, we pray only for ourselves when we are in a situation of worry or when we are in need. During National Service, a very common prayer to make is one for strength. This was something I prayed for a lot, especially on particularly long and tedious days. However, I realised that the focus of my prayer was solely on myself. Yes, the Lord can grant strength in times of need, but Moses' prayer taught me that this is not the most important thing to pray about. When I pray to the Lord, my consciousness should be on Him and my relationship with Him, and all other things come after that. Ultimately, the most important thing in our life is the Lord and our relationship with Him.



God as our King

Moses continued in prayer, regarding the Lord as King. Israel could not have made it this far if it were not for the Lord. The Lord's power and guidance with them were so apparent, that it was only fitting for Moses to describe the Lord as King. He is a King who cares for His people and loves them dearly. Despite all of Israel's flaws and many mistakes, the Lord still loved them. He did not need to have a reason to love, and this reflects the Person of God. This is a special relationship that the Lord had with Moses and the children of Israel which Moses acknowledged in his prayer.



The idea of God as King is not a foreign concept. But seeing this in the context of Israel reminded me of the Lord's power and love. Over the course of studying Israel's history at Youth Worship, we have traced God's Hand in Israel's journey out of Egypt and through the wilderness. I am reminded that this same God is also watching over me and it is Him that I put my faith in. I am encouraged to let the Lord rule over my life. I cannot depend solely on myself, but instead, I need to rely on the Lord. I am seeking to be more conscious of Him in my daily life and to remember Him in prayer daily. As a church, let us also cultivate this consciousness of the Lord in prayer as we continue to pray for Pastor and Aunt's recovery!
